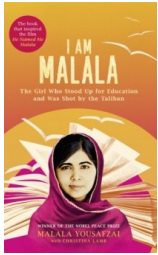
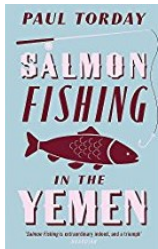

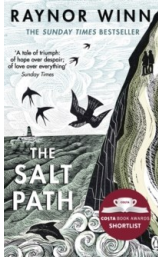
## I am Malala by Malala Yousafzai

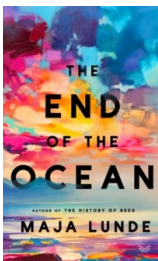
## Salmon Fishing in the Yemen by Paul Torday

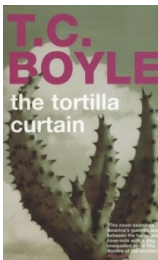
## The Salt Path by Raynor Winn
