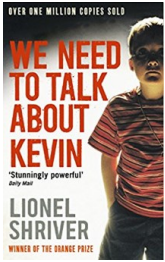

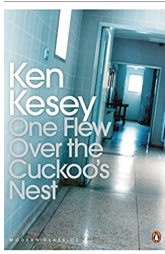
We Need to Talk about Kevin by Lionel Shriver

Who is to blame for Kevin's horrific rampage? His mother questions whether her alarming dislike for her own son may be responsible for small town murder.



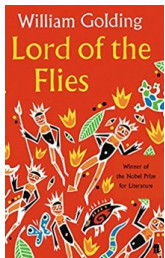
The Collector by John Fowles

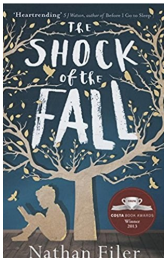
One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest by Ken Kesey

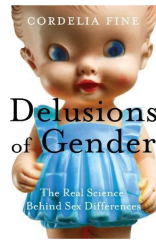
The Man Who Mistook His Wife for a Hat by Oliver Sacks

Neurologist Oliver Sacks recounts case studies of patients lost in the bizarre, apparently inescapable world of neurological disorders. **616**



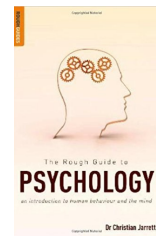
