Use the [SACU Cloud Tool](#) to match your A-levels to degree subjects. It allows you to see where students with your A-levels were placed in previous years and view actual A-level combinations by course, by subject and by university group.

A Demolition Operative safely dismantles structures, performs "soft strips" (removing internal fixtures, windows, and hazardous materials), and separates recyclable waste.

To work in the UK, you typically need a [Certificate of Competence of Demolition Operatives](#) card, a CSCS card, and an [Asbestos Awareness Certificate](#).
