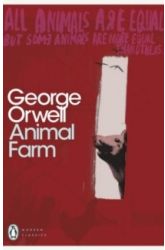
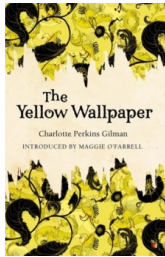

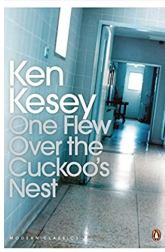
Animal Farm by George Orwell

Having got rid of their human master, the animals in this political fable look forward to a life of freedom and equality. Gradually a ruthless elite start to take control and “equality” is not all it seems.



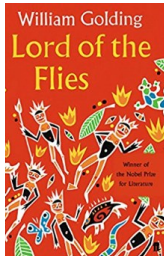
The Yellow Wallpaper by Charlotte Perkins Gilman

The story of a nameless woman driven mad by enforced confinement after the birth of her child.



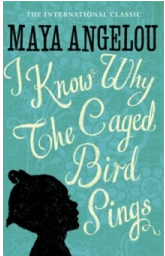
One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest by Ken Kesey

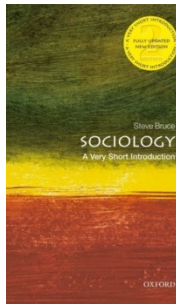

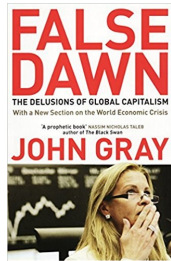

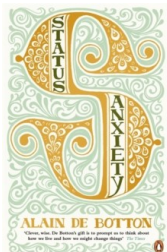
Sociology: A Very Short Introduction by Steve Bruce

A quick exploration of the individual's place in society and society's role in shaping the individual. **301**



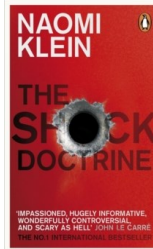
False Dawn: the Delusions of Global Capitalism by John Gray

Gray's book sharply criticises the greed and unsustainable economic practices which have proved to be the seeds of world-wide recession. **330**



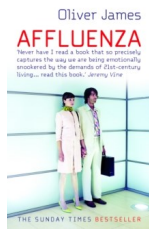
Status Anxiety by Alain de Botton

We all worry about what others think of us. We all long to succeed and fear failure. Botton gives a name to this universal condition and sets out to investigate its origins and possible solutions. **158**



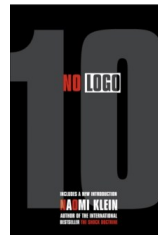
The Shock Doctrine: the rise of disaster capitalism by Naomi Klein

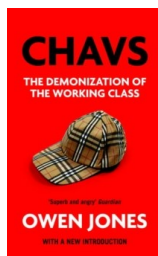

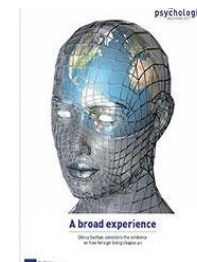
