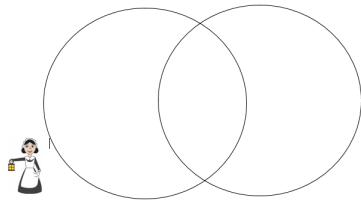
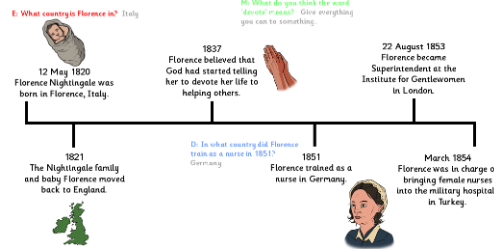
Key Individuals

Florence Nightingale 1820—1910
Mary Seacole 1805—1881



Key Facts
Florence Nightingale had a pet owl.
Mary Seacole wrote an autobiography called the 'Wonderful adventures of Mary Seacole'.
Seacole was referred to as Mother Seacole
The War Office refused to let Seacole be a nurse in the war.
Florence Nightingale is referred to as 'The Lady with the Lamp' because she looked after sick soldiers during the night.
During the Crimean war, Mary Seacole set up a hut on the battle field and served hot meals and looked after injured soldiers.
