Key Vocabulary	Definition
Personify	Represent (a quality or concept) by a figure in human form
Portray	Show (someone or something) in a particular way .
Analogue	a person or thing seen as comparable to another
Develop	The chemical process used to treat photographic paper to create an image.
Exposure	The amount of light that reaches photographic film.
Characteristic	a feature or quality belonging person which helps to identify them:

How is a photograph made?
To take a photograph of something, the lens makes a small picture of the object inside the camera. The lens does this by focusing light. A lens in a camera works like a lens in glasses or a magnifying glass.

What makes a great portrait photograph?
There are many ways to take a portrait photo for example: change the angle you take the photo from e.g. Get up high and shoot down. Have the person look at something beyond the camera and move the lighting around the sub-

How has photography changed over the years?
Photography changed our vision of the world by providing more access to more images drawn from more places and times in the world than ever before. Photography enabled images to be copied

Key Facts
She is best known for her engaging portraits—particularly of celebrities.
She became the first woman to hold an exhibition at Washington's National Portrait Gallery in 1991
Leibovitz attended the San Francisco Art Institute, where she studied painting with the intention of becoming an art teacher.
She started her career as staff photographer, working for Rolling Stone magazine
