hands 	touch 

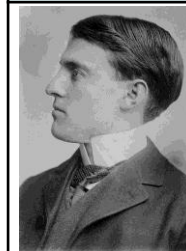
Key concepts / diagrams:

taste	lets us tell if something is sweet, salty, sour or bitter
hear	lets us notice sounds using our ears
tongue	lets us taste food
fingers	the small parts at the end of our hands
skin	covers our body
sight	lets us see
