| Dialect | The language spoken in a particular region. |
| Scale | The relationship between the distance on the map and the distance in real life. |

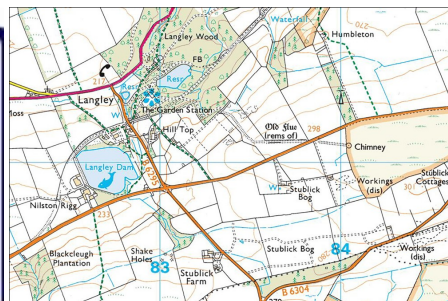
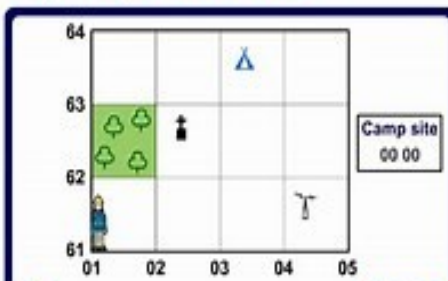
