Year 5 have shown incredible creativity in Art, exploring typography and how design can communicate meaning. Alongside this, they've delved into the fascinating world of the Tudors, uncovering stories of monarchs, power, and change.

And in Year 6, we've seen resilience, teamwork, and joy as pupils returned from their residential trip, eager to share their experiences. Their reflections have been heartfelt and inspiring, showing how much they've grown both personally and socially.

Nursery

We have had a very busy half term in Nursery, making new friends and enjoying lots of different learning experiences.

Our topic has been 'All About Me' and we have been talking about similarities and differences between us and our friends and members of our families. We have learned about the different parts of the body and had lots of fun exploring our senses!



In Maths we have been looking at shapes and noticing if they have flat or curved faces. We then built our own models with them – large and small.

We've tried mark making in all forms, using paint, chalk, water, pencil and pens using the techniques of painting, printing and drawing.



After half term we are looking forward to learning about the different family celebrations observed by the children in Nursery!

Reception

The children in Reception have settled into the first term of school. We have spent a long time learning how we

behavior and play with our friends in school. It is lovely to see the children smiling, running and skipping into school!

We have now started to learn our phonics and we are beginning to blend the sounds together to read words and segment the sounds to be able to write words. The children are showing great attitudes towards learning and are persisting when they have found the learning tough!

In Maths this term the children have been learning to represent number on their fingers and on paper as well as using key words like more, fewer, bigger, smaller, heavier and lighter. The children have been applying the learning to our challenges and in everyday conversations.

This term we have started our Explore and Learn sessions with the children. We have practiced our Golden Rules, been on a hunt for the different colours of the rainbow and have been out looking for the signs of Autumn.





Last week we also enjoyed a visit to Rushall farm, where the children were able to feed spinach leaves to the chickens, stroke Will I am the lamb, see the cows, go on a trailer ride, dig for worms and go for a walk in the woods.

The children have defiantly deserve a well earned rest during half term.





Year 1 has had a great start to the academic year! They have settled in well with their new rules and routines and have become independent learners. We have loved writing descriptive, and statement sentences about different type of animals in our English lessons. We explored the text "Coming to England" in our Reading lessons and became more fluent by using our phonics. We loved learning about the seasonal changes in science which included identifying different weather and about shadows as we discover what day and night looks like, as well as making our own windsocks and rain gauges. We have also found out all about temperature. We have also been enjoying our Math lessons as we have learnt how to count, identify numerals and match them to their words, and learned greater than, less than and equal to when comparing numbers. In P.E we learnt how to create our own dance while mirroring our friends. In PSHE we have been finding out how to be a good class member. We have been learning about the family tree and identifying who the oldest and youngest family members are in our own family, as well as exploring the past and present life of King Charles III in our History lessons. In Music we have been learning about pulse and marching, clapping or using the instruments to create a rhythm pattern to the beat of the music. Finally, in Art we learnt how to create spirals and made lots of spiral creations!

Well Done Year 1, we can't wait to see what next term will have in store for us!


















During our first term we have had an exciting unit in DT about towers. The children explored existing towers and what makes then stable, before designing and building their own.






In Geography we learnt all about using an atlas and the children explore the continent of Europe, including some of the countries within it.





We also celebrated Black History Month this term. Year 2 were given Mary Seacole to learn about. They learnt about why she was significant in history and wrote some lovely facts about her life.



What a fantastic start to Year 3 we've had! The children have settled in brilliantly and have shown great enthusiasm across all subjects.

In Reading, we've been diving into *The Stolen Spear*, a gripping Stone Age adventure that has captured everyone's imagination. The children have loved exploring the characters and plot twists, and it's sparked some brilliant discussions. Building on this, we've used the book as inspiration in our Writing lessons, where pupils have been crafting their own sentences using exclamations and statements to express ideas clearly and creatively.

Our History lessons have been equally exciting, as we've been learning all about the Stone Age. The children have really engaged with this topic, especially when they had the chance to examine real artefacts from the time period—an unforgettable experience that brought history to life!





In PE, we've been exploring dance, using characters from *Matilda* to inspire movement sequences. The children have worked collaboratively to create expressive routines and have shown great creativity and confidence.

In RE, we've been learning about Sikhism. A highlight was our first Year 3 trip to the Sikh Centre, where we deepened our understanding of the religion and were warmly welcomed. The children asked thoughtful questions and showed great respect throughout the visit.

We're so proud of how Year 3 have started the year and can't wait to see what the next half term brings!

Year 4 have had a brilliant start to the year, showing curiosity, creativity and teamwork across all subjects.

In Maths, we've been focusing on **place value**, using lots of **Dienes blocks and counters** to help us understand the value of each digit. The children have enjoyed using practical resources to build numbers and compare them.

In Writing, we've been learning how to use **main and subordinate clauses**, connected by **conjunctions**. Pupils have worked hard to improve their sentence structure and have produced some fantastic pieces of writing.







In Reading, we've been enjoying **Matilda** by Roald Dahl. The children have loved getting to know the characters and discussing the story's themes of bravery and cleverness.

In RE, we've been learning about **Judaism**, exploring key beliefs, traditions and celebrations. The children have asked thoughtful questions and shown great respect for different faiths.

In PSHE, we've been discussing **equality** and learning how to **value ourselves and others**. Pupils have reflected on what makes them unique and how we can all help create a kind and inclusive classroom.

We're so proud of Year 4's efforts this half term and look forward to more exciting learning after the break!

Year 5 have had an action-packed start to the year! We are very excited to share some of the wonderful work that has been created this term across all subjects, the children have really focused on producing high-quality and creative pieces and should be very proud of their achievements so far!

The children have loved our reading book – Kensuke's Kingdom – this term and have demonstrated great understanding of the themes and characters in the exciting book by Michael Morpurgo.

In Writing, Year 5 have looked at a range of grammar features: participles, adverbs, relative clauses and appositives; producing detailed and imaginative ideas based on our reading book - Kensuke's Kingdom.

Math – place value, addition and subtraction – has been tackled head on and the children have shown a good understanding of working with numbers up to 1 million! They have challenged themselves with word-problems and become experts at column method.

In Science there have been an array of experiments to explore the properties and changes of materials. The children have enjoyed testing how some materials can change while other changes are irreversible; also testing different methods of separating materials with a range of equipment.















In Music, the children have enjoyed practicing their songs for the Junior Music Festival. They had a wonderful experience coming together with other schools in the area to rehearse with the conductor of the performance and are on their way to becoming incredible performers!

History took Year 5 back to Tudor times this term, studying the life of the notorious Henry VIII (and his 6 wives!) as well as Elizabeth I and Henry VII. Artifacts from the local museums were a massive hit with both classes, they were used to help the children research the day to day lives of people in Tudor times.

In Art, we have explored both typography (lettering) and map making looking at a variety of artists who are leading their fields. The final projects produced were maps that reflected the children's identity. We were blown away by the freedom and creativity that the children had shown throughout the project.

Well done to all of the students for their commitment to learning so for year progresses.

What a fantastic half term it's been! Our learners have been busy across the curriculum, showing creativity, resilience, and a real enthusiasm for learning.

In English, our budding writers have been exploring a range of sentence structures, including relative clauses and expanded noun phrases, to add depth to their writing. They've also practiced using split speech, embedding reporting clauses to enhance their storytelling. We've immersed ourselves in the powerful story Rose Blanche, building rich word and phrase banks to support our writing. The children are now planning their own alternative endings, experimenting with different styles and descriptive techniques — it's been wonderful to see their creativity and confidence grow.

In Maths, we began the term by revisiting place value to strengthen our understanding before moving on to written methods for addition and subtraction. The children have made great progress and are now tackling multiplication and division. We've noticed that fluency with times tables is key to success in these areas, so regular practice at home is encouraged to help free up working memory. Through varied fluency tasks, pupils have been consolidating their skills before applying them to reasoning and problem -solving activities.

In Reading, we've been diving into Letters from the Lighthouse by Emma Carroll. The children have been developing key comprehension skills, becoming more confident in scanning texts for key information and constructing thoughtful responses. We continue to focus on reading fluency and encourage daily reading at home to build stamina and expand vocabulary — both essential for success across all subjects.

In Science, our topic Light has sparked curiosity and wonder. We've explored how light travels in straight lines, how shadows are formed, and how we see objects through light reflection. A highlight was investigating anaglyph images while learning about filters — a fun and engaging way to see science in action!



In Geography, our unit Our Green Planet has taken us on a global adventure through a variety of biomes — including rainforests, woodlands, tundra, deserts, grasslands, and savannahs. The children explored each biome's location, climate, flora, fauna, threats, and adaptations. They've enjoyed presenting their learning in creative formats such as non-chronological reports, fact files, leaflets, and even radio scripts.



In Art, we've been inspired by Lubaina Himid in our project 2D Drawing to 3D Making. The children scaled up animal silhouettes and used Dickens-inspired illustrations to create collages. They practiced hatching and cross-hatching to add tonal value, then cut out their designs and constructed stands to transform their 2D work into striking 3D pieces. It's been a wonderfully hands-on and creative experience.

In Music, our topic Making Waves has helped us explore sound and expression. The children have worked collaboratively to discuss orchestral pieces using varied musical vocabulary. They've learned to identify and change pitch and dynamics, taken on the role of conductor, and experimented with texture through group improvisation. They even created graphic scores to represent sound — a brilliant way to visualize music!



Our residential trip to PGL Liddington was a huge success! The children were a credit to our school their behavior was exemplary, and their teamwork and enthusiasm were inspiring. They had great fun taking part in adventurous activities, supporting one another, and stepping outside their comfort zones. We're incredibly proud of all they achieved.



Back at school, those who didn't attend the residential had a brilliant time too! They worked on passion projects, designed their own board games, and created stunning oil pastel artwork. It was a joy to see their confidence grow as they presented their projects with clarity and pride. A few days filled with creativity, collaboration, and success!

School lunches




