#### World Mental Health Day

On **Monday 10<sup>th</sup> October** we will be celebrating World Mental Health Day. We will be raising money for the Young Minds charity, so will ask for a donation of £1 towards this amazing cause. We will spend the week learning about mental health, strategies for a healthy mind and how to get support to help when experiencing mental health problems. We look forward to seeing the children in their bright yellow on **Monday 10<sup>th</sup>**.

#### What have Nursery been learning about this week?

Nursery have had a fantastic couple of weeks settling into school and getting to know their teachers and their peers. We have been learning and practising lots of routines, which the children are now experts at! This week in topic, we have started thinking about similar and different, including how we are similar or different to our friends. The children have been discussing different hair and eye colours and drawing portraits of their friends and themselves using mirrors. We have also been singing lots of number songs and rhymes in maths and have had fun using sticks to drum outside in phonics, where we were exploring the different sounds we could make by drumming on different objects. On Tuesday we had lots of fun when Nerys Pearce came to visit us as part of Team Super Schools. The children joined in with lots of different exercises and had fun moving their bodies in different ways, they were all very excited to have a special guest in to visit us!



#### What have Year 1 been learning about this week?

We have had another great week of learning! We started adding and subtracting in maths. Students are getting really into it using manipulatives to break down part-whole numbers. In writing we innovated our model text from How to wash a woolly mammoth to how to wash a woolly sheep. Both instructions require an entire bottle of bubble bath! In geography we looked at the UK, its capital cities, and flags. In science we became weather forecasters and predicted wind direction using our very own windsock! Students were blown away with how much activity our windsock has been getting over the last week. In PSHE, we talked about good and bad choices and how all choices have positive and negative consequences. R.E., we continue our look at the Christian creation story and what we can do to take care of His creation. In art, we continue to work on our self-portrait drawing and in music we explored the dynamics of a song by learning the difference between piano and forte!



#### What have Year 3 been learning about this week?

We have had another fun couple of weeks of learning! In maths we are moving on to adding and subtracting and we have been really impressed so far! In writing we are looking at a new text, which is a set of instructions on 'How to catch a troll'! We have come up with some very imaginative ideas about why we may want to catch a troll. In PSHE we have been learning about consequences, that every action we make has either a positive or a negative action. We played the hidden treasure game where we had to try and collect the treasure without being found out. In art we have created some amazing collages, and we are looking forward to using the techniques to plan are create a cubism masterpiece.

In R.E we have been looking at the Sikh ceremony Amrit Sanskar, we got to make Amrit! This has made us all excited to visit the Gurdwara so parents please can you make sure that you have completed the consent form!





What have Year 5 been learning about this week?

Year 5 have had an incredible week! We really enjoyed our Team Super Schools session and loved hearing the incredible Nerys Pearce talk about her life and achievements. She really reminded us how important resilience and determination are throughout life and how we can use these skills to achieve our ambitions and goals. In English this week, we have been learning all about explanation texts. As part of this, we went of a treasure hunt. It was so much fun! We had lots of clues that we had to follow to find it. From this, we were able write explanations for the best place to hide treasure. Some of us think the desert, a cave or a rainforest would be the best hiding place. Where would you hide your treasure if you had any?

Use **Garage** to update your heatmap to show you the times tables you know really well and which ones you still need to work on.
