What have Nursery been learning about this week?

In Nursery over the past 2 weeks the children have enjoyed watching the chicks hatch and grow. The eggs were labelled 1 to 10 and we all voted for the one that we thought would hatch first. Egg number 3 hatched last Wednesday just after the children had gone home but luckily Mrs Hamblin caught it on video and sent the video to all the children via Tapestry. This week the children have enjoyed holding the chicks.



What have Year 2 been learning about this week?

This week, Year 2 have set up an experiment to test the growth of plants under different conditions. We spent some time exploring the life cycle of a plant and learned that they need air, water and light to grow. We wanted to find out what would happen if the plant has no light or no water. Hopefully we will see some results soon! In Maths, we started our topic of fractions. We LOVED using chocolate hoops to share our whole number into equal groups. We are starting to become confident in recognising halves, quarters and thirds. For International Women's Day, we studied Amelia Earhart. She was a famous aviator who was the first woman to fly across the Atlantic Ocean solo. What an achievement!











We have had a very fun packed week in Year 4 with lots of different lessons! In English, we are exploring a historical narrative set in Roman Britain! We have used a model text to inspire our writing and we thought about how the

character would be feeling and what he may be thinking throughout different parts of the story. We then innovated some elements of the story to create our own historical narrative! Take a look at our thoughts and feelings poster and some of our writing below!

In History, we are also learning about the Romans! We discussed how and why the Roman invasion of Britain was so popular and then gathered our thoughts with post it notes. We then were introduced to our Powerful Person for this unit... BOUDICA! A woman who stood up to the powerful Roman Empire and led her armies into battle. We explored different representations of her and then wrote our impression of her- you can see this learning below.

In Science, our powerful person is the late, great Stephen Hawking (who also happens to be one of our House Teams) we learned about Hawking's extraordinary life and the many challenges he had to face and overcome. Please see our learning below!

What a week! Year six have been working really hard in Maths. This week they have been looking at area, perimeter and volume – improving their accuracy lesson on lesson.
