Year One have had a great week this week, as we got really stuck into our diary entry innovations. We became superheroes for the day and had some exciting adventures, which we recorded in our diaries. Miss Costello and Miss Jeffery were so impressed with the children's use of time connectives, conjunctions and first person. We have also been thrilled to see how well our runner bean plants are growing – we have been using our knowledge and skills that we have acquired over the past few weeks to describe what the plants look like and measure how tall they are growing. We can't wait to take them home soon and see if we can harvest some beans!

A big well done to everyone for the enthusiasm towards our career dress up day today. We are sure that with lots of hard work our Year Ones can achieve whatever they set their minds to!

What have Year 3 been learning about this week?

This week in our Geography lessons, we had lots of fun making deserts out of playdough to help us learn the features of deserts. There are some photos of our creations below. In Science, we have been continuing to have fun with magnets and forces. We talked about what objects had a push or a pull and which poles on magnets attract and which repel. We have also been writing our own book reviews in English and discussing what features we need to use. The children have written some excellent work, so well done Year 3.




