## What have Nursery been learning about this week?

Nursery have had a brilliant week settling into school and getting to know each other and their teachers. This week we have been exploring our environment and learning routines for carpet time, tidying up, handwashing and other times of the day. Some of the children's favourite activities have been using the playdough, playing in the role play area and threading the string to make their fingers strong! The Nursery teachers are amazed by how well the children have all settled in and are looking forward to getting stuck into more fabulous learning next week!





#### What have Year 1 been learning about this week?

Year 1 have settled back into school fantastically! We are so proud of how they have picked up the routines of Year 1 so quickly and got straight into some great work!

Over the past couple of weeks in English we have been writing about Little Red Riding Hood. The children have done 2 amazing pieces of writing, including their own version of Little Red Riding Hood where they independently chose their own character to replace the wolf in the story. In Maths we have started with some basic counting and recording of numbers to 20. This includes some counting forwards and backwards. We are now going to continue onto comparing two amounts using less than, greater than and equal to. As well as this, in Science we have been observing our shadows. We made puppets to cast shadows of different characters. We also went outside and had a go at drawing round our partners shadows with chalk. Keep up the good work Year 1





## What have Year 3 been learning about this week?

We have had a fantastic few weeks settling in to year 3. We could not be prouder of how well the children have come back to school! In Maths, we have been focusing on place value. We have really enjoyed partitioning big numbers up to 1000. In Writing we have began innovating a narrative of a child who is given something forbidden. In science we have loved experimenting with rocks and looking at the similarities and differences. Thank you to all parents and carers who have helped make the transition from year 2 to 3 much easier.

### What have Year 5 been learning about this week?

Over the last few weeks, Year 5 have been working extremely hard. All the children have settled into the new year extremely well and are demonstrating great maturity. In Maths, we have been focusing on the place value of numbers up to 1,000,000. Here are some pictures of us using Gattegno and place value charts to support us in our work. In Science, we have been learning all about the properties of materials. This week, we completed an experiment to see which material was the best conductor. We all had great fun and used our prior knowledge from Year 4 to help us accurately create a working circuit. Lastly, the teachers would like to thank everyone that turned up the parent teacher meeting on Wednesday. It was lovely to see so many faces and to meet so many of you.


