What have Reception been learning about this week?

This week the children have enjoyed learning about trains old and new and had great fun creating trains in the outside learning environment to go on exciting adventures with their friends! We have been listening to the sound made by trains as they clatter along the train tracks and have copied the rhythm using the musical instruments. In maths we have been reminding ourselves about addition using ten frames and are getting very good at writing the teens numbers. We love spending time in the reading shed when the weather is a bit too hot and sunny!











What have Year 2 been learning about this week?

This week, Year 2 have been writing their own versions of the Tortoise and the Hare. We have seen lots of innovative fables like "The Polar Bear and the Penguin" and "The Lion and the Giraffe." They have made for some exciting and enjoyable reads. In Maths, we are recapping fractions. We are learning how to find half, quarter and a third of a number. We have learned that fractions are equal parts of a whole number, and it is important that all parts are the same size. Next week, we will be covering non-unit fractions and word problems. In Science, we have been super scientists! Last week, we created rainbows using mirrors, and this week, we created our own telephones. It was fun to try and communicate with each other using our own inventions. In History, we continued to learn about old toys and explore change of toys through the decades. We are really looking forward to our trip to Beale Park next week and especially seeing all the animals!

What have Year 4 been learning about this week?

This week, Year 4 have continued learning about the Anglo-Saxons. We found out about what their houses looked like and how they were made. Next week, we will have a go at making our own structures using the wattle and daub methods. This meant we had the opportunity to go out into the field and forage for sticks and materials to make our

structures. It was lovely to see the children's enthusiasm while doing this practical activity. We are also very excited about our trip to Dinton Pastures this week - spending more time adventuring out in the fresh air.

Note: It would be great if the children could bring in an old t-shirt for Tuesday's history lesson – it could get messy!

What have Year 6 been learning about this week?

This week Year 6 have been learning about the Victorians. We found out all about Doctor Barnardo and all he did to help children's lives improve. We have continued learning how to tell the time in French and this week explored how to use the 24-hour clock which involved using numbers up to 60 in French. We have been practising our leaver's assembly and have been reminiscing over memories from our time at Palmer to include. In PSHE we have been thinking about transition and thinking over worries and anxieties as well as the excitement we have about secondary school. It has also been very exciting as some of us have visited our new secondary schools and spent the day finding how what life in our new schools will be like.


