If you child has sickness or diarrhoea they must remain off school until 48 hours after the last episode.

This term we have been learning all about the children and next week we are learning about their goals and aspirations. On <u>Thursday 9th December</u> the children need to come to school dressed as the job they want to do e.g. police officer, chef, teacher, mechanic, pilot etc.

Covid-19

If your child is showing any symptoms of Covid 19, namely a high temperature – this means you feel hot to touch on your chest or back, **OR** a new continuous cough – this means coughing a lot for more than an hour, **OR** 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours (if you usually have a cough, it may be worse than usual), **OR** a lost or change to your sense of smell or taste – this means you've noticed you cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal. If you have **ANY** of these symptoms, get a PCR test (test that is sent to a lab) to check if you have coronavirus and stay at home until you get your results, even if the symptoms are mild. Lateral Flow Tests are to detect asymptomatic cases, not for use when displaying symptoms.

What have Reception been learning about this week?

We have had another exciting and fun filled week in Reception this week, especially as we are starting to get ready for Christmas! For our writing assessment we watched the John Lewis christmas advert 'The Bear and The Hare' and used the phonics and writing skills we have learnt this term to write a sentence about the advert, it has been lovely to see the progress the children have made so far!

In topic we have been learning about places of worship that are important to different religions. It has been great to share our experiences of lots of different religions and cultures and see what the children remember about the religious celebrations we have learnt about previously. In maths we have been learning to use the vocabulary 'one

more' and 'one less'. The children have been practising all week using different ways to represent one more and one less including five frames, activity mats and even lego bricks! We are very excited to start preparing for Christmas, which will involve lots of singing, art and crafts!



What have Year 2 been learning about this week?

What an exciting week filled with lots of different activities! This week has been great because we've thoroughly enjoyed writing about the Aldi Christmas advert for 2021, really focusing on using our imaginations and retelling the story in our own words. If there's one thing we've learnt from the advert – it's that the secret to happiness is kindness! In DT we finally got to use our recycled materials to create our own towers and have been trying our very best to make them as stable as possible. We know that a stable tower all depends on its shape and type of material used. In Maths, we're developing the concept of multiplication by creating equal groups and writing addition sentences using repeated addition. We're feeling festive in the classrooms with lots of Christmassy activities coming up but remain focused and ready for the last couple weeks of school.

What have Year 4 been learning about this week?

Yet again in Year 4, we have had a super week with so many different activities! In our writing lessons, we have loved retelling the 2021 John Lewis Christmas advert. We were touched by the sweet story of young boy who befriends a mysterious alien girl, introducing her to his Christmas traditions. We have all put our own spin on the story and we know our teachers are very excited to read them.

In maths, we have been exploring our 3, 6, and 9 times tables. Next year, we will have a Times Table check so it's very important that we are all practicing our tables up to 12x12 whenever we can. In science, we are learning all about the digestive system starting with the teeth. We conducted an interesting investigation, using egg shells to represent our teeth. We then filled cups with 3 different liquids- sugary Cola, vinegar and water. We were shocked to see what happened to the egg shells and it inspired us to consider more carefully what we are eating and drinking. In our History lessons, we explored the Greek writing system and compared their letters to the ones we use. We also learnt about different Greek myths – some sad and some scary. We can't wait to see what next week's learning brings.

Wow! What a week. We have been getting back into the swing of things following our residential to Ufton Court...WHICH WAS AMAZING! We all had such a wonderful time sharing new experiences, helping prepare dinners,
