## What have Nursery been learning about this week?

In Nursery this week we have been reading the story of Little Red Riding Hood. The children have enjoyed learning about the different settings and thinking about what they might hear, see, feel, smell and what it may be like to touch different item. The children came up with some super describing words and phrases: rough tree trunk, slippery slimy mud, and hard rocks.

In maths this week we have been using the words long, short and round. We have been searching the school for long, short, and round objects and made a list of what we had seen.









#### What have Year 2 been learning about this week?

This week in Year 2, we have been busy completing our Maths and Reading assessments. It was time to show off what we have learned so far this year and we are so proud of all our achievements. We tried our best and used all the different strategies to show our teachers how much we have learned! In assembly we also looked at Chinese New Year and made some paper lanterns to celebrate the year of the Tiger. In PE, we continued our dance unit but re-enacting the life cycle of a butterfly. We used lots of different movements to show the evolution from a caterpillar to a pupa to an adult butterfly. Finally, we finished our fact files on crocodiles and are now experts on the topic! #### What have Year 4 been learning about this week?

We have had a fantastic week at school! In reading, we used our inference skills to write a diary entry as if we were Matilda! We had to infer how she would be feeling whilst using exciting vocabulary from the text.

In maths, we have been learning all about area. On Monday we investigated this by using post it notes to cover 2D objects. We concluded that it wasn't the most accurate method, and we were excited to start using standard units to calculate area.

In science, we are learning all about Animals and their habitats. We were challenged to write a non-chronological report using both our writing skills and scientific knowledge. We also used iPads to independently research our chosen animal in order to gather more information. In Geography we are loving our volcanos topic! This week, we learnt about 3 different types of volcanoes and defined different technological terms before creating a model of a volcano. We can't wait to see more fantastic learning next week! Please keep supporting your children at home by reading with them at least 3 times a week, ensuring they complete their MyMaths and Edshed homework and of course practicing their times tables in preparation for our test in May.













#### What have Year 6 been learning about this week?

This week, Year 6 have been learning about micro-organisms in Science. They really enjoyed having the autonomy to present their findings however they wished. They completed fact files on the 3 types of micro-organism after research. Did you know, one type of micro-organism - viruses - are so small they can even live inside bacteria?!?! We have also been working on our newest Palmer Power, FOCUS! If you see us coming home with orange dots on our collars, you know we have been super focused in our lessons at school.

We have also enjoyed our English unit on interviews too, whereby we have returned to a previous piece of work to create the content of an interview. We have been practicing deepening our questions to encourage more detailed answers and have been recalling all previous learning to construct answers using a range of descriptive features. 
