Children's Mental Health Week

This week is Children's Mental Health Week and the theme this year is Express Yourself. The week aims to raise awareness of the importance of young people's mental health and BFfC is promoting it on our social media channels all week. Online counselling and support service for school staff






What have Year One been learning about this week?

What an exciting week we have had in Year One! We've had more home learning than usual, due to our Year 1 bubble closure and have had so much extra engagement with our online tasks as a result! We've continued to learn about poetry through the weird and wonderful poems of Edward Lear in English and have loved reading and seeing some of the children perform their adapted version of 'The Jumblies'. We've come to the end of our addition and subtraction within 20 unit and finished it off with a fun quiz on Friday. We were so impressed with how the children got on! In science we explored how some materials are better suited to objects because of their properties. The children created some fantastic drawings of special religious clothing in R.E and of their local area in Geography. Many of the children also enjoyed exploring Reading on Google Maps! We finished exploring 'The Tiger Who Came to Tea' in our reading lessons and have now begun to find out some fascinating facts about tigers through exploring a non-fiction text. We have also had fun learning how to debug a program on Scratch Jr and creating some beautiful concentric shapes in art!

What have Year Two been learning about this week?

It's been another great week in Year 2 and we have been so proud of all the engagement especially on teams. We have loved reading all of your work and also seeing your great quiz scores. Keep it up Year 2. In maths we have been learning about statistics and the children have gained understanding of block diagrams, pictograms and tallies counting in different steps. In writing we have been writing poems all about the wind and what it can do in different seasons. We have been impressed with the beautiful language chosen. I have also loved reading your very detailed explanations of what happens in Holy Week at Easter time for Christians. Science has been a very exciting time for year 2 as we begin to see how our bulb experiments have developed. Look at Sujal's daffodil and how it has changed over the last few weeks. This week we began another experiment where we are growing some seeds in the dark and some in the light. We will be recording when they start to germinate and anything else, we notice. I wonder if our predictions will be right.





What have Year Four been learning about this week?




