Note from the Executive Headteacher

We are really looking forward to having all the children return to school next week at Palmer; after what feels like a long few months of home-learning, we are all set to see everybody back on Monday!

Thank you for taking the time to speak with your child's class teachers this week as part of the parent consultations; I hope this was really valuable in helping you to discuss how your child has been doing since Christmas, and how they are feeling about the return to school next week.

Naturally, there are going to be some anxieties with the children, and perhaps yourself, with the return next week. Please be assured that we have risk assessed for the re-opening and ensured that we are following the government guidance to us on operating safely, including keeping to our bubbles, keeping socially distant, increased cleaning and regular handwashing or sanitising. Please help your child prepare for next week by ensuring that messages about returning to school are positive and supportive, particularly after such a long period of not being in school. I am sure many of them are very excited to see their friends next week, and we are planning to ensure that we are flexible in the first day or so to allow the children the time to re-adjust.

School Office

Please be reminded that the school and nursery offices remain closed to parents/carers and we cannot allow access to the building unless under exceptional circumstances due to COVID restrictions. We are finding many people with general queries are queuing up at the window to speak to someone, however, this does not allow our staff the protection of remaining isolated in their bubble. ALL general enquiries, questions or requests must be made by phone or email allowing staff to respond safely. If your request is urgent, please ring the bell on the intercom to speak to staff safely. Please make sure your child brings everything they need each day, some parents/carers are coming back with forgotten water bottles/PE kits, etc. We will leave a large plastic box outside the front door for urgent items to be left in, please make sure they are labelled so we know who to pass them on to; however, please avoid doing this unless absolutely necessary, as it means admin staff breaking their COVID bubbles if they have to go to other areas of the school.

Water bottles

There are a number of children across the academy who do not have a personalised water bottle with them each day. For reasons of hygiene as well as convenience and practicality, we ask that your child is sent in with a named water bottle that they can refill as necessary. We do not have sufficient cups or washing facilities to provide each child with an individual cup each day. Reminder letters will be sent home next week for those children without named bottles in school each day. Thank you.
