#### Children's remote learning at home feedback

The work children have been sending in this week has been fantastic and it has been brilliant to see the resilience of our pupils during this time. I look forward to seeing more in the coming weeks and thank you to all parents/carers for your support in facilitating this.

### <u>Reminder – pupil absences</u>

It goes without saying that if your child is attending our critical worker/vulnerable school bubble for face-to-face education during this lockdown and they are displaying any COVID-19 symptoms, they should remain off school until they have been tested to determine what needs to happen next. Please remember that if you are your child has symptoms and is isolating, you should not be leaving your house, except in an emergency in order to limit the spread of the virus with others.

#### Bringing in Fruit/Vegetables for Break Time Snack

As per the government announcement this week, we have been informed that the School Fruit and Vegetable scheme (SFVS) has been temporarily suspended. Our critical worker and vulnerable children who remain in school are welcome to bring in a piece of fruit or a vegetable to eat during break time. A packet of dried fruit such as raisins or cheese is also permitted. KS2 children are also welcomed to bring something in.

#### Welfare checks home

Our staff will be continuing to call each child/family at least once a week during the lockdown, if they are not attending the in-school provision. This check will enable us to give feedback to the children about their learning, answer questions you may have and see what other support we can give. It's really important that your child engages with the remote learning we are providing so that they continue with the curriculum and do not end up with even more gaps in their knowledge. Please be aware that as most staff are working remotely, the calls may come from an 'unknown' number, and so please do pick up, or else you will be unable to call us back.

#### What have Nursery been learning about this week?

Welcome to our new children who have started Nursery this week albeit virtually. In Nursery we have been learning about The Gingerbread Man story and the child both in school and at home have been learning about the characters in the story.


Also, a huge well done to our Year 1 school bubble, who have worked super hard this week, despite missing their friends!




## What have Year Two been learning about this week?









#### What have Year Three been learning about this week?







#### What have Year Four been learning about this week?

Also, well done to Kaiden for all the fantastic learning he has sent in, we really enjoyed reading your English and seeing this amazing design of your Greenhouse for DT.


Furthermore, we are very proud of the children in our school bubble who have been working very hard and are becoming quite the experts in French. Très bien!


#### What have Year Five been learning about this week?


In English we have been exploring a campaign and Cooper has created a wonderful feature hunt to identify the key elements of a persuasive speech.
