What have Nursery been learning about this week?

In Nursery it has been lovely to see both our exisiting children and our new children join our Nursery. The children have settled really well and have enjoyed exploring the environment. We have been focussing on our rules, routines and the behaviours needed to be able to keep safe. The children have been listening really well to the social stories we have read and have been contributing to group time discussions already!



What have Year 1 been learning about this week?

Year One have had a fantastic couple of weeks packed full of new learning and getting to know each other. We have begun all our new topics, which the children are really excited about!

In English, we have started learning to retell the story of Little Red Riding Hood. We've had fun creating our class story map and acting out the story using our best actions. In maths, we have been exploring our resources by finding out how many different ways we can sort them (colour, size, type, shape) and finding out how we can use them to count. In science, we have been on a nature walk to search for the beginning signs of Autumn, as part of our seasons topic. We found some leaves changing colour, some had already fallen and we even found some conkers on the ground! In geography this week, we have been discovering what we already know about farms and what we would like to know next. In computing, we became robot children who had to follow a sequence of instructions to reach the

treasure chest full of colourful, shiny treasure! We have also been sharing lots of different picture books – our favourite so far has been Ruby's worry.

Our P.E. lessons are on Tuesdays and Thursdays each week, so please remember to come to school in your kit on these days.



What have Year 3 been learning about this week?

We have been delighted to welcome all the children back to school the last two weeks, it is so lovely to see all the happy, smiling faces and the children have settled really well, showing they are keen to learn and show us what they can do. We have been really impressed and pleased with them so far, well done Year 3!



We have been looking at place value in Maths and reminding ourselves about Hundreds, Tens and Ones and how to read and write numbers up to three digits long (eg 324). In writing this week, we have been learning a short story about a boy called Alfie who has something in his pocket he isn't allowed – please ask your children to tell you more if they haven't already! We have also started reading our class text, The Twits. We will be reading this book for the whole of the Autumn Term so hopefully you will hear lots about these dirty, smelly creatures.

In our afternoon subjects, we have been starting all of our new topics, including Light in Science, Our European Neighbours in Geography and Getting to Know You in French, to name but a few. We will also be having PE lessons on Tuesdays and Fridays, so please remember to come in PE kit in those days.

<u>Uniform</u>


Please label your child's clothing, lunchbox and stationery so it is easier to locate and item if it is lost. Any lost property will be placed in a plastic bin near our edible garden.


School Photos
