What have Nursery been learning about this week?

This week the children have enjoyed learning about their families. We have drawn family photos, making sure we add in facial features. We have learnt about the importance of Remembrance Day and why we wear a poppy.



What have Year 1 been learning about this week?

Year 1 have had a fantastic start to the term! We spent our first day back enjoying building (and eating!) our own gingerbread houses as we were introduced to our new text 'Hansel and Gretel'. The children have since been learning to retell the story and we have seen some incredible presentation from many of the children writing the story this week. We have moved on to some really tricky maths this week, as we have been learning to compare statements. The children have enjoyed using their resources to calculate each statement before comparing them using the <> = symbols. In science, we have started learning all about animals, with a particular focus on mammals this week. Please ask your children about this – they now know some interesting facts about them! Next week we will be learning more about birds and reptiles!



What have Year 3 been learning about this week?

What a busy two weeks we have had since we've been back from half term! We are starting to see some real progress from the children with their work, effort and determination, which is wonderful. In our Writing lessons, we have been looking at the story of the Hare and the Tortoise, and we are using this to write our own diary versions of this story, but with our own characters. The children have had some wonderful ideas and it is a joy to read what they are creating. In our Maths lessons, we are finishing with addition and subtraction and starting to move towards multiplication and division. This should start to be reflected in the MyMaths homework the children will be getting and hopefully your children will be able to tell you all about it.



We have also started new topics in our afternoon subjects. We are now learning about the Stone Age in History and we are learning about healthy eating as part of our Animals Including Humans unit in Science. We are taking on the role of Personal Trainers to help some clients make their diets work for them and their needs. We are also starting to learn the words for some body parts in French, so feel free to challenge your children to recall some of these at home!



We are very grateful to those of you who attended Parents' Evening, it was lovely to see so many of you and be able to chat (and show you) about how well the children are getting on. If you missed your appointment or were unable to make it, we will hopefully be in touch soon to try and catch up with you.



What have Year 5 been learning about this week?

Year 5 have made such a great start to the term and have already demonstrated such focus in their learning. Miss Billins is so excited to finally be teaching Hughes full time and thoroughly enjoyed meeting with parents this week during parents evening. Thank you to all who attended. In music this half term, year 5 have been focusing on Jazz music. This is a great way to explore a wide range of musical skills such as improvisation. Last week, they began learning a piece of music and used the glockenspiels to accurately play and perform that piece. This week, we focused on improvisation and continued to explore tempo and pitch. We really enjoyed having the ability to create our own patterns and rhythms during this process and look forward to adding these improvised pieces to our performance. 
Tea Party at the end of the school year. You will need to have practiced a lot and have become a **Rock Hero** to receive a prestigious invite!


As it is a new term, we will begin the tallies again, so let's see how the classes did this week!
