The number of positive covid cases in school has been steadily rising this week, this includes pupils across all year groups and a number of staff. I undertand there is a short supply of lateral flow test kits available in the community, but where possible, please can I ask you to test your children before returning to school on Monday and regularly throughout the week. Government guidelines will change again on Monday 17<sup>th</sup> January, reducing the minimum isolation period to 6 days (day 0 which is the positive test day/symptoms + 5 full days). Any pupil who tests positive will be able to return to the school setting on day 6 ONLY IF they have a negative lateral flow test on day 5 and day 6, 24



hours apart. Anyone who still tests positive must continue to isolate for 10days. Please follow the link for the <u>updated guidance</u>.

#### What have Reception been learning about this week?

This week the children have been enjoying finding out about our class authors – Judith Kerr and Michael Rosen and writing Fact Files with the information they have found out. They have become 'book experts' and can talk about fiction and non fiction books, authors, illustrators and poets aswell as describe all of the parts of a book including the spine and the blurb. We are very lucky to have a new Reading Shed and the children have loved sharing stories inside it with their friends or reading quietly on their own. In maths we have been comparing numbers and using words like more, less, fewer, equals and the same as to describe them.

It's really important that the children continue to practise the letter sounds and tricky words they have learned during their phonics lessons and therefore have opportunities to do so during their independent learning time. It's equally important that they read reguarly at home with an adult, complete their home learning and bring their reading folder to school every day. We thank you for your support with this 😊







#### What have Year 1 been learning about this week?

Year 1 have settled back in after the holidays amazingly, ready to start some hard work again! In maths we have been focusing on some addition and subtraction using numbers that we have been learning up to 20. This has included using physical resources such as ten's frames, counter, number lines and part whole models to practice. In writing we have been using an exciting story to spark out writing, called 'Daisy's Dino Egg'. We even managed to innovate it this week by changing the character of a dinosaur to an alien to make it even more exciting! In the afternoons, we have started our history topic surrounding 'where we live'. The first lesson both classes were able to label places where we and our families are from in the world, so we could discuss just how diverse we are as a class and a school! Our science topic this term is 'everyday materials'.

Please continue to keep up the reading at home with your children. A reminder that it is recommended to be reading the book they have been provided with at least 3 times to



gain fluency before bringing it back to be changed. Our day for changing books is a Thursday. Thank you 😊

#### What have Year 3 been learning about this week?

We have had a brilliant start to the term in year 3! We have all returned to school refreshed and ready with a fantastic attitude for learning. In maths we have been focusing on our multiplication and division and with our determination we are doing an excellent job at multiplying and dividing 2-digit numbers with a 1-digit number! We have enjoyed writing a non-chronological report about dragons in writing and produced some lovely work! In geography we are looking at our topic 'Where does our food come from" and have created some lovely comic strips detailing the journey of a banana from growth to our stores. Our science topic this term is plants, this week we have planted some seeds, which we will be watching grow!

Many of our children have done a good job completing their homework and are bringing their reading records ready for a new book. Please carry on encouraging your children to do their TT Rockstars, Spelling Shed and MyMaths, and encourage them to read weekly, completing their AR quiz after each book.



## What have Year 5 been learning about this week?

Year 5 have made a great start to the new by returning to school with a such positive attitude. They have demonstrated such resilience as they've readjusted to our school day and we are very proud of them. Many children have completed their homework this week but we had quite a few that needed reminding. Please encourage them to do this at home as it really does have an impact on their learning. All children should



be completing: TT Rockstars, Spelling Shed, Mymaths and reading weekly. This week, Year 5 have been learning all about plants in Science. We dissected flowers so we could investigate how pollination takes place. It was such fun! In French, we have been learning all about food and how to describe which foods we do and don't like. We played



a board game to practise our vocabulary and got very competitive.
