



What have Reception been learning about this week?

We are continuing to watch our caterpillars on their journey to becoming butterflies and have been amazed at how quickly they have changed. Most of them are now at the chrysalis stage a we are predicting when they will emerge as butterflies.

We had great fun during our outside learning time looking for things in the school grounds that we had spotted on an aerial photograph - things looked quite different! Whilst outside we collected materials to use with playdough to make a home for a minibeast, some of the children are hoping that we can make a tree for our butterflies to sit in when they finally emerge!

In maths we have been exploring 3D shapes and working out which shapes will stack easily and why others will not. Our mapping theme has continued with the story of 'What the Ladybird heard' and we've had great fun thinking up alternative animal sounds to confuse the burglars.

We are looking forward to our trip on Monday 28th March to Rushall farm and would like to remind you that we will be outside for most of the day so a warm coat is needed and it is likely that the children will also need wellies. Thank you.









What have Year 1 been learning about this week?

Year 1 have been continuing lots of fab learning on our story in English, which is the 'The Ugly Tadpole'. We have had some lovely innovation ideas this week when it came to changing the story for our own character. Such as a foal, starfish and unicorn. All of which have been lovely to read – we are very proud of how much everyone's writing has come along this year!

As well as this we have continued to do learning on weight in maths this week. We were able to get out the balancing scales and choose objects from all around our classroom to weigh and record, before commenting on which of them are lighter and heavier than one another.

Also in topic, we have been doing more learning on plants in science. In particular looking at wild and garden plants and exploring the differences and different types. We have also continued some interesting learning all about explorers from our past in history. This included both Neil Armstrong and Ibn Battuta, who are our powerful people this term. Keep up the good work everyone!

Please continue to read with your children at home — a reminder that our changing day for books is on a Thursday and we encourage children to read a book 3 times for them to gain fluency before changing. We are becoming rock experts in Science, trying to identify different types of rocks, finding out about their properties and also learning lost about what fossils are and how they are made. We're looking forward to seeing you all at Parents' Evening next week, don't forget to make an appointment if you haven't already.








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What have Year 5 been learning about this week?


