
In maths we have been using positional vocabulary and have been challenged with describing to our friends where we have put the toys in the doll's house.


What have Year 2 been learning about this week?

Year 2 have been continuing to learn all about money in Maths this week. We are nearly at the end of the unit and the only thing we have left to learn is how to give change! In DT we learned about Gustav Eiffel who designed the world famous Eiffel tower in Paris. We learned lots of facts about his early life as well as what inspired his tower design. Our Writing unit concluded this week with a diary entry discussing how Mary Anning discovered the ichthyosaurus fossil while searching for curiosities on the beach. In Science we learned about the life cycle of different animals. We found out that some animals give birth to live young whereas others lay eggs. Do you know the difference? What have Year 4 been learning about this week?

It has been another fantastic week in Year 4 with a real range of activities and lessons! In English, we are writing diary entries about an exciting day we have been on and Mrs Aucock and Miss Davies have loved reading these and seeing which children can show off their use of fronted adverbials and pronouns. In maths, we have started a new unit all about multiplication and division. We have been learning what happens to numbers when you multiply and divide by 10 and 100. In History, we have been learning all about the Ancient Greeks and we even had a little go at some Olympic events! We have also been placing significant events on a timeline and learning all about the different government structures of Ancient Greece. In Science, we explored and constructed food chains and now we are learning all about the important role teeth play in the digestive system. Take a look at some of our amazing learning below



What have Year 6 been learning about this week?

Year 6 have been working hard this week to demonstrate how much progress they have been making. We have seen huge improvements in some of the most recent assessments and look forward to this continuing further. Year 6 continue to work on their knowledge and understanding of fractions and have been learning about Ernest Shackleton's great expedition across the Antarctic in English. In History, we have been using our feedback from our last oral presentations and from Palmer Parliament manifestos to help us write in role as political party leaders to create speeches to persuade the general public to vote for them. 

The next results are in... As you can see, the engagement has slipped a little. The score works as an average, so it is important that the whole class plays in order for the score to increase at a good rate. Consider your child's current status. By year 4, children should be able to answer all


their times tables in less than 6 seconds – (a breakthrough artist). This means they should answer at least 10 questions in a minute and should be playing at least 10 minutes per day. This would equate to 700 points per week. If everyone is playing in class, we should see scores close to 700 per class. Please encourage your children to use TTRockstars daily – could it be made part of your morning or after school routine?





