Note from the Executive Headteacher

This week at Palmer we have been talking about bullying and what we can do to support anyone who is being or has been affected by this. As part of anti-bullying awareness week, we are continually reinforcing the message that bullying is NOT OK, and that we stand 'United Against Bullying'. It's also been important for us to remind pupils what bullying is - and is not; some children might fall out with one another occasionally, get into a dispute or say unkind words. Please remember to talk to your child's teacher in the first instance. 





What have Year Five been learning about this week?


