Note from the Executive Headteacher

This week we welcomed Jenny Redgrove (Deputy Director of Education from REAch2) to the Palmer Academy, who supported Mr. Prendergast and me with a review of our Maths curriculum at the school. During her visit, Mrs. Redgrove went and visited many of the classrooms, saw and spoke with our children and looked at their work. Mrs. Redgrove also spent some time doing this with our Maths Lead, Miss. Gundry, so that we could look at what we were doing well with, and what we could do to make our Maths teaching even better. I was particularly impressed when I was asked to visit Year Five during the day to see how much progress they had been making with learning their times-tables and getting better at their scores every week! Our children really enjoy their Maths work at Palmer, and one of the things we want to get even better at is using resources and manipulatives in our lessons so that children can make those links between the concrete, pictorial and abstract representations (for example, being able to count out cubes to help them with adding, showing this in a drawing of adding two groups together, and then turning this into a written calculation). This will help all our children, including our most able, become more fluent and independent in their learning. We welcome back Mrs. Redgrove next week to look at our teaching of Phonics and reading across the academy.

What have Nursery been learning about this week?

This week in Nursery we have been learning about planes and rockets. As part of our learning we have been reading the story 'I Am Amelia Earhart'. The story is about how Amelia Earhart was the first lady to fly across the Atlantic Ocean at the fastest speed and at the highest altitude. We were really impressed that the children could remember Amelia's name and what she did! During choosing time the children have been making rockets out of junk materials and blocks, planks, and material.



What have Year One been learning about this week?

It's been another busy week in Year One! We continue to learn about making equal groups and arrays to support our new learning of multiplication. We have also started learning our doubles facts so practice those doubles facts at home to help your child become a doubles expert! We have started writing our new Bumblebee stories and have finished up our book of the term *Giraffe's Can't Dance*! In our foundation subjects, we have had a busy week of sculpting with clay, learning all about the holy land of Mecca, more fun facts about the arctic, and how the seasons affect the length of our days. Why not try keeping a log at home of when the sun sets to help your child see how the day lengths are getting longer as we lead up to the Summer Solstice on June 21st? The children have been working hard, learning lots, and supporting and challenging each other like the fantastic learners they are becoming. Keep up the great effort year one – and don't forget about the Half-Term Readathon! Mr Soares-Mistry is a BIG fan of ice cream so let's win that ice cream party!

What have Year Three been learning about this week?

Wow- how fun this week has been! In our reading lessons, we have been continuing to enjoy *Charlie and the Chocolate factory*. On Monday, we read the chapter *Augustus Gloop goes up the pipe*. We had to create questions to delve deeper into the thoughts and feelings of the characters and then we took the hot seat to answer these! It was so funny and interesting to pretend to be Willy Wonka!

In writing, we have been learning the different features of the Pie Corbett poem *My World*. My favourite lesson was when we explored onomatopoeia by making different sounds around the classroom.

In maths, we did some more learning about time. We had to apply our skills, knowledge and understanding through a range of different questions. It was great to use the practical clocks to help us achieve this.

In science we were testing the effects of friction! We had to see how high ramps covered in different material had to be before the toy cars moved!

We want to say a big thank you to Miss Chandler for making our book corner come to life! It's based on our class author- Floella Benjamin and her journey from the Caribbean to England. We were so excited to see that Floella Benjamin herself retweeted the picture we posted!
