What have Nursery been learning about this week?

This week in Nursery the children have been learning about 3D shapes and going on shape hunts around the classroom and outside area. We have been really impressed with how the children have been learning the new vocabulary and shape names. We have also been learning to hear the initial sounds in words and sorting words into groups.





What have Year One been learning about this week?

It's been another busy week in Year One! In maths, we have been learning how to order numbers and use the language of position and direction to describe objects' positions – right, forwards, backwards, left, right, above, below. Can you find some opportunities to use these words at home this weekend? In reading, we continue to explore *Malala's Magic Pencil* and we have been discussing the words *peaceful*, war, equal, and poverty. A wonderful story to support this learning at home is Nicola Davies' *The Day War Came*, which helps to illustrate these concepts in a very child-appropriate context. Our foundation subjects have brought lots of excitement to our



In History, we continue to learn about the Victorian seaside holidays and how they were made popular by the invention of the steam train and in computing we have been using a 21st century technology to program Bee Bots with our own algorithms! In science, we continue to learn about everyday materials and their properties. We investigated why we choose different materials to do different jobs or to construct different objects. Even though we are steadily moving towards the end of the school year, our learning in Year One hasn't been slowing down! Keep up the great learning Year Ones!

What have Year Three been learning about this week?

It has been a fun and exciting week in Year 3! We have learned all about 2D and 3D shapes as well as the different types of angles.
