#### What have Nursery been learning about this week?

This week the Nursery children have been learning about the different events we celebrate. The children have been talking about how they celebrate birthdays, bonfire night, Christmas, Eid, Diwali, Chinese New Year, weddings and Christening at home. At Nursery we have been making cakes and talking about how the mixture changes.



#### What have Year 1 been learning about this week?

We have had another fab week in year 1! In English we have focused on learning our new poem 'The Perfect Porridge'. We have had fun learning about different types of poems, before adding actions to our model text and having a go at writing it ourselves! In maths we have been practicing our numbers from 11-20. As well as using some fun songs to practice our numbers, we have also been working in teams to match and order our numbers. This will help us to be able to talk about which numbers are smaller or greater next week. Also, in Year 1 this week, we have continued to learn about the History of Reading. In particular looking at Huntley and Palmer's biscuit factory, getting a chance to explore some of the difference between the old biscuit tins and some new biscuit packaging's. We even got a chance to taste some of the present biscuits too, which went down a treat!

#### What have Year 3 been learning about this week?

This week in Year 3 we have been looking at poetry in English. We have been reading a Pie Corbett poem about candlelight which uses personification, alliteration and rhyme. Hopefully the children can remember the poem to recite to you and tell you what these features mean! We have also been learning about the three periods of the Stone Age – the Paleolithic, the Mesolithic and the Neolithic periods – and we've learnt a little about the introduction of farming and how this changed the way people lived. We have also been learning about a balanced diet in science and what a healthy plate might look like. We even got to make some models out of plasticine – see below for some fab examples. We continue to be impressed by the hard work, determination and drive of the children in our classes, and we are grateful for the support they are getting at home with completing their homework too, thank you parents.




#### What have Year 5 been learning about this week?

During RE, we have been learning all about the Christmas story. As part of our learning, we had Fr. Peter visit us. It was so interesting! We spent an entire lesson asking him questions all about Christianity and the Christmas story. We learnt so much. In Science, we have been learning about animals and their life cycles. This week, we explored gestation periods and made some fantastic posters all about them. Did you know that an elephant's gestation period can be up to 22 months! This blew our minds. Our teachers were so impressed by the research we did. We even taught them some new facts too!
