What have Reception been learning about this week?

This week in our Explore and Learn' time the children enjoyed exploring a new way to record what they have seen. We practised using crayons to make leaf rubbings. We then compared the rubbings with the leaves to see if they looked similar. This week in topic the children have been learning about Judith Kerr, they could remember what a fact file was as well as name some of Judith Kerr's books. In maths we have been learning to add 2 numbers together and record the number sentence for it.








What have Year 2 been learning about this week?

We've had a fantastic week so far and have had lots of fun learning about the different features needed for a letter – we look forward to applying these features in our own letters and sharing them too! In Maths, we continue our unit on multiplication and division. We've been using our grouping and sharing techniques to find our answers and understand how important it is to practise our times tables! In Geography, we have learnt how to locate and identify the 7 continents on a map. We have also learnt where the different hot and cold places on Earth are, with the help of our atlases. We are loving learning about animals and different life cycles in Science. Keep up the hard work Year 2s!

What have Year 4 been learning about this week?


It's been a brilliant two weeks in Year 4 and we are so proud of our wonderful learners. Last week, we completed our fantasy narratives, and we wowed our teachers with the range of features we used as well as our brilliant punctuation-take a look at some of this learning below! This week, we have started learning about our new text type- non-chronological reports. We have learnt what generalisers are and have started to use some in our writing. Look at one of our whiteboard sentences from our Talk for Writing lesson.

In maths, we have started a new unit all about length. So far, we have recapped how many metres make up a kilometre and applied our skills, knowledge and understanding of conversion to answer fluency and reasoning questions. You can see just a snippet of this learning below.



What have year 6 been learning about this week?

Year 6 have continued to learn about the ocean this week in Geography and explored the effects of overfishing. Pictured below, you will see earlier work on the layers of the ocean and research around the Great Barrier Reef. We have also prepared our printing tiles for our final art lesson next week where we will be doing some block printing in the style of Andy Warhol. This week we have begun learning about a new text type – explanation tests – and have revised some of the features that a prominent in this genre of writing. We have been practising using these feature writing about wellington boots. We have used bullet point lists and semi colons in 'Some ; others' sentences. Mrs Nightingale and Mr Thorne are looking forward to seeing how our writing progresses next week when we will be writing about our own footwear.







We're heading into the final tournament of the half term. Will anyone be able to beat Binch Class? The classes below have not changed for a while. I wonder who can flip the tables around for next week?
