What have Nursery been learning about this week?

It has been a very exciting week in Nursery as we have been starting to think about Christmas! We put up our Christmas tree and the children all helped to decorate it, some even made their own decorations for the tree! In topic we have been thinking about what the children want to be when they are older and how they can set goals in order to achieve what they want to do. We have lots of future firemen and vets in our class! In phonics this week the children have been using different instruments to put on a show for their friends. We all listened to each other play an instrument and then said why we liked it, the children loved putting on a show for their friends. We are looking forward to next week when we will be doing lots of Christmas crafts and learning about the Christmas story!



What have Year 1 been learning about this week?

In Year 1 this week we have been learning about persuasive posters in English. The children have been learning the text 'Come to my Candy House' and we have had fun learning lots of actions to go with it.

In Maths we have been recapping everything we have learnt so far on 2D and 3D shapes. The children really impressed us by being able to sort the shapes by colour, type of shape and curved/flat shapes.

In Science we had a fun experiment to see which materials would make a good material for a house. We used models and a fan to test out the different houses and see which would do well against the big bad wolf!

We have continued to work hard with our singing and practice for the Nativity next week. We look forward to being able to show you all next week in our 2 performances!

What have Year 3 been learning about this week?

In science, we have been investigating friction with different materials. We measured how far a toy car travelled on different materials and were shocked at some of our results. In DT, we have been making pop up pages and have been really impressed by the children's resilience in trying out different mechanisms. We have also spent some time practicing 'Rockin' Around the Christmas Tree' ready for our rendition at the Christmas carol concert. Please keep practicing at home! This week we have also been acting out a Horrible Histories stone age episode to summarise all that we have been learning about this period this term. In maths, we have been focussing on our 3, 4 and 8 times tables – please keep practicing these at home as much as possible.







What have Year 5 been learning about this week?

This week Year 5 have been discussing If the the Christmas story is true? And one of our lessons was making our own christingles. We talked about how they symbolise the world and the sacrifices Jesus made. Each parts of the Christingle has an important meaning behind it. The sweets skewed on sticks represents the fruit of the Earth, the orange represents the world, the candle represents Jesus as the light of the world, the four sticks represents the four compas direction and the four seasons and finally, the ribbon represents the blood of Jesus. The kids had a blast doing this activity and even shared several opinions surrounding making this amazing activity.




