What have Nursery been learning about this week?

This term our new topic in Nursery is My Family, My Story. The children have had a great start to the topic so far, last week we looked at pictures of the children and the teachers as babies, toddlers and now to see how they have grown and changed. This week we have been looking at family photos and talking about who is in our family. The children have loved looking at photos of themselves and their families and trying to guess who is who in their baby photos! In maths we have started to use Ten Town to learn about number 1 and number 2, we have been singing the songs and even going on walks around the school to see if we can spot the numbers! This week we have also been doing some lovely hand printing to make poppies to go on our wreath for Remembrance Day on Friday.



What have Year 1 been learning about this week?

This week we continued learning about fairy tales in English where we innovated our wicked witch to an evil wizard. For maths we continued our adding and subtracting unit where we added one more and two more and played some maths games. In history we continued learning about our family tree and the order of youngest to oldest. For science, we worked in teams to explore our classroom for objects that were made up of multiple materials. In computing we played with b-bots and in design and technology, we completed an experiment on what materials are waterproof for our umbrellas! We also took time this week to make a wreath for our Remembrance Day assembly on Friday.

What have Year 3 been learning about this week?

This week, we have been writing some amazing diary entries inspired by 'The Tortoise and the Hare', we have been really impressed by the creative ideas the children have thought of. We also enjoyed our first science lesson with magnets where we investigated which materials in the classroom are and are not magnetic. For History, we travelled back to the palaeolithic and mesolithic periods to explore what life was like. This week, we have also made a poppy wreath to mark remembrance day which we will lay in our remembrance service on Friday.



What have Year 5 been learning about this week?

Last week, all of Year 5 went to the University of Reading. We had the most incredible day! We attended a History lecture and sat in a massive lecture hall. We got to talk to students from the university and ask them questions about what the university offers and what we can learn there. Lastly, we had a tour of site.



This week in Maths, we have been learning all about fractions: equivalents, improper fractions and mixed number fractions. Yesterday, were began adding and subtracting fractions. This is what our homework is based on this week so please help us if we get stuck.
