#### What have Reception been learning about this week?

This week the children in Reception have been talking about their feelings and what makes us think and feel the way that we do. We have listened to stories, including 'The Colour Monster' and 'Angry Arthur' and thought about how we can self regulate. In maths we have been exploring repeating patterns and have made them using shapes, pegs and paints.





#### What have Year 2 been learning about this week?

Year 2 have had another busy week. In English, we are learning how to write instructions, specifically instructions on how to catch a star! We know exactly what equipment we'll need to catch a star and if there's one piece of advice to share... it's that you can only successfully catch a star at night-time and to never trust seagulls because they might just steal your star! In Maths we continue to use our resources to help us solve addition problems. Keep practising your bonds to ten and related facts year 2s, this knowledge always makes adding a lot easier! In Geography we are learning all about Europe and how to successfully use an atlas. We've been using our atlases to name and identify the different countries and landmarks around Europe. We can't believe we're almost at the end of the term, how quickly the time has gone! We will continue to work hard and enjoy our time at school: learning and spending time with friends.

#### What have Year 4 been learning about this week?

Year 4 have had an exciting week as we completed our 11 before 11 experience with a hike through Dinton Pastures. The weather was perfect, with the sun shining as we trekked around the lake and experienced some of the wildlife. We saw different water birds and linked them to our class reading book of Why the Whales Came. We also spotted some molehills and lots of squirrels! In RE, we continued our topic of Judaism as we created and decorated mezuzahs, which are Jewish holy prayers affixed to doorposts. Finally, in Science we have learned all about the water cycle. We set up our own water cycle model in the classroom and have been observing the four stages throughout the week. It has been a very busy week and are looking forward to enjoying the weekend.









#### What have Year 6 been learning about this week?

Year 6 have been having a fantastic few days away and luckily the weather has been kind. They have been taking part in lots of different activities including wall climbing, zip lining, buggy building and finishing off their days with cosy camp fires and dancing the night away at a disco. I'm sure the children will be very excited to share all of their experiences with you. 
