Dear Parents and Carers,

You may remember that last year, we focused on Reading as a whole-school initiative. This project led to significant progress in children's reading skills and fostered a deeper love of books across our school community. Thank you for your support in making that such a success and we are continuing to use this practice in school.

This year our focus is on adaptive practice. This approach ensures that teachers and support staff tailor their teaching to meet the individual needs of each child, helping them to thrive. The staff work hard to ensure they know and understand your child well —how they learn best and the support they need—they then plan adapted tasks or introduce additional support to make learning accessible to everyone.

Adaptive practice involves a variety of strategies, including:

- Using resources like counters or visual aids.
- Asking targeted questions to deepen understanding.
- Providing prompts or partially completed sentences to support writing.
- Including words with pictures to aid comprehension.
- Offering alternative ways for children to present their learning.

These adaptations are designed to ensure that all children can engage with and succeed in the same learning objectives, in a way that suits their unique needs.

Adaptive practice is key to our provision as we continue to nurture an inclusive, supportive, and thriving learning environment for all our children.

As always, we greatly appreciate your partnership in supporting your child's education and if you would like further information of how to support their learning at home, please don't hesitate to speak to the class teachers.

Parking

A friendly reminder to please refrain from parking on double yellow lines or zig zag markings. Doing so poses a danger to our children as they enter and leave the school premises. Uniform

School lunches

Parents are now able to cancel and book school dinners up to 9am in the morning. Please remember to order for your child before this time and cancel any meals not required should your child be absent for the day, you will still be charged if meals aren't cancelled. Meals should only be ordered by the school office on the <u>rare occasion</u> that you may have forgotten to order. We are still experiencing a high number of pupils every day that have no school dinner ordered – if this continues, we will phone parents to bring in a packed lunch so could you ensure you have booked for the week ahead. Please speak to the school office if you need a reminder of how to order through Parent Pay.

Dear Parent/carer

KENDRICK SCHOOL – WIDENING HORIZONS

We are writing to you as a parent/carer of a girl in school Years 3, 4 or 5, who is in receipt of pupil premium (free school meals or who has received free school meals in the last six years), service premium or is in care or has previously been in care, and who lives within our designated area.

We would like to invite you to our Information Evening on Tuesday 26th November 2024 from 4.15pm – 5.30pm to explain what Widening Horizons at Kendrick School is, and for you to find out how we can help to support your child on their academic journey, and the opportunities that are available to them at Kendrick School during School Years 3,4 & 5, completely free of charge.

These opportunities are to enrich the academic lives and learning of any girls who fall within this category, and not just for those who are considering Kendrick as a secondary school, (although these students would be accepted with a lower score and be provided with free practice papers, an online learning programme and a test familiarisation day in the summer holidays, should they decide in due course to sit our Admissions Test.)

We are also delighted to inform you that Kendrick School has been awarded the Sutton Trust Fair School Admissions Award at **Gold** level. The top **Gold** level is awarded to schools who have made significant changes to their admissions policies to ensure that there is fair access to all pupils regardless of socio-economic background. Kendrick was recognised for the multiple systems we have in place to support access for children eligible for pupil premium funding within our Widening Horizons project.


