# **Parking**

A friendly reminder to please refrain from parking on double yellow lines or zig zag markings. Doing so poses a danger to our children as they enter and leave the school premises. Additionally, we kindly ask that disabled badge holders avoid parking in these restricted areas. If you hold a disabled badge and require proximity to the school for accessibility reasons, please reach out to our office. We're here to support you in finding suitable parking arrangements.

# **Uniform**

Could we please ask Parents/Carers to make sure all uniforms are clearly <u>labelled</u>. Nearly all the uniform emptied from the lost property bins is unnamed, making it impossible to return to the rightful owners.

# **School lunches**

Parents are now able to cancel and book school dinners up to 9am in the morning. Please remember to order for your child before this time and cancel any meals not required should your child be absent for the day, you will still be charged if meals aren't cancelled. Meals should only be ordered by the school office on the <u>rare occasion</u> that you may have forgotten to order. We are still experiencing a high number of pupils every day that have no school dinner ordered – if this continues we will phone parents to bring in a packed lunch so could you ensure you have

booked for the week ahead. Please speak to the school office if you need a reminder of how to order through Parent Pay.

# **School Photographer**

All children in Nursery through to Year 6 will have their photo taken in school on Wednesday 6th November.

As these photos are for parental use only, we will assume all children have consent to have their photo taken. If you DO NOT wish for your child's photo to be taken, please call the office to let us know.

Please ensure your child comes to school in full school uniform on this day (including school jumper/cardigan) so that they will be ready for their photograph.

### **Letter from Kendrick School**

#### **KENDRICK SCHOOL – WIDENING HORIZONS**

We are writing to you as a parent/carer of a girl in school Years 3, 4 or 5, who is in receipt of pupil premium (free school meals or who has received free school meals in the last six years), service premium or is in care or has previously been in care, and who lives within our designated area.

We would like to invite you to our **Information Evening on Tuesday 26**<sup>th</sup> **November 2024 from 4.15pm** – **5.30pm** to explain what Widening Horizons at Kendrick School is, and for you to find out how we can help to support your child on their academic journey, and the opportunities that are available to them at Kendrick School during School Years **3,4** & **5**, completely free of charge.

These opportunities are to enrich the academic lives and learning of any girls who fall within this category, and not just for those who are considering Kendrick as a secondary school, (although these students would be accepted with a lower score and be provided with free practice papers, an online learning programme and a test familiarisation day in the summer holidays, should they decide in due course to sit our Admissions Test.)

We are also delighted to inform you that Kendrick School has been awarded the Sutton Trust Fair School Admissions Award at **Gold** level. The top **Gold** level is awarded to schools who have made significant changes to their admissions policies to ensure that there is fair access to all pupils regardless of socio-economic background. Kendrick was recognised for the multiple systems we have in place to support access for children eligible for pupil premium funding within our Widening Horizons project.

#### Good afternoon,

My name is Gavin Harper from the Safer Public Realm Team at Reading Borough Council. The SPR Team look at ways to resolve Anti-Social Behaviour and related issues that are caused, enabled or exacerbated by a common factor rather than an individual perpetrator. We work closely with TVP, support services, local businesses and residents to try and resolve or reduce these issues.

While responding to a complaint regarding noise and dropped litter in the area of the shops shown below, on Northumberland Avenue, a number of residents stated that they have seen school children dropping litter outside the shops.

While no child or school has been identified and I am fully aware that you have no responsibility for what a child does outside the school, I thought it worth me sending an email so that you are aware of the possibility.

I wondered if at all possible, you may be able to reiterate the importance of putting litter in the bin to those children who walk past this area.

The main problem area is shown below, indicated by the red arrow.



The prevailing wind, helped by passing cars blows any dropped light litter into the gardens of the residential properties opposite the shops.

An inspection of the litter shows mostly items bought in the shops opposite. The shop keepers have no responsibility for the goods once they leave the shops.

There are 3 bins, used but not full, along the shop frontage. There is every opportunity for a person to place litter in a bin.






