#### What have Reception been learning about this week?

In Reception this week we have continued our topic of 'Celebrations' by learning about the Muslim festival of Eid. We noticed lots of similarities with other celebrations. We found out that special food is often prepared and shared with family and friends, people dress up in their best clothes and ladies and girls might have Mehndi patterns painted on their hands. People also exchange gifts and cards.

In maths we have been looking at groups of four and five objects and how we can split these totals into two smaller groups using the part, part, whole model.

The children have all enjoyed using our new reading books and we look forward to seeing lots of observations on Tapestry of your child talking about their book, explaining the new vocabulary and reading the story. #### What have Year 2 been learning about this week?



In Maths, we have started learning all about 2D and 3D shapes and have been able to sort the shapes into various categories. In English, we have been using our creativity to innovate Mary Anning's diary entry, there have been some amazing ideas and innovation. We continue to read about Claude and all his adventures with Sir Bobblysock in our reading unit. We have been exploring lots of new vocabulary and are developing our retrieval skills to find information from the text. In Science we had a lot of fun learning all about different materials and were able to select which materials would be best to design a window. We have also started learning the songs that we will be singing in the nativity at the end of the term. How exciting!

#### What have Year 4 been learning about this week?

We have had a brilliant week in Year 4! We have been learning all about The Romans in History and this week, we explored our Powerful Person Boudicca. In DT, our unit is called "On a Roll" and we are learning all about the process of making bread. We enjoyed trying some different types of bread and giving our opinions on them.




