#### What have Nursery been learning about this week?

This week in Nursery we have been learning all about celebrations. We have been talking about what we celebrate with our families and learning that some of the things we celebrate are the same and some are different. We talked about what we do when we celebrate our birthdays including have cake, balloons, birthday cards and presents. We even had a go at making our own cakes and talked about how they had changed when we took them out of the oven. In maths we have been learning about repeating patterns. We learnt how to continue repeating patterns and also had a go at making our own patterns using the resources in the classroom.









#### What have Year 1 been learning about this week?

This week in maths we started geometry and we explored 3-D and 2-D shapes. In English, we looked at different types of poems. We worked with the fairy tale Goldilocks and the Three Bears and learnt that it was a free verse poem. In science, we did an investigation using magnets and tested if all metals are magnetic. In DT, we looked at different materials for building our umbrellas and for computing we programmed out bee bots to find a treasure on a treasure map. We also started practicing for our Nativity play, check your emails for show days, times, and where to get tickets!

#### What have Year 3 been learning about this week?

Year 3 have had another lovely week, working hard and exploring new things! We could not be prouder of how they not only represented themselves but the school as well to all the guests we've had in the school. In English we have been looking at poetry and have had a go at creating our own poems, using rhymes, personification and alliteration. In science we researched the uses of magnets in the real world! Some of the children even wowed us by taking their learning home and sharing with year 3 what they had learnt! In History we travelled back in time to the stone ages and created some beautiful cave paintings! We have been really impressed with their multiplication skills in maths!










#### What have Year 5 been learning about this week?
