






What Have Year 1 Been Learning About This Week?






What Have Year 3 Been Learning About This Week?

This week, we have enjoyed learning more about plants as we continue this in science. We had a lot of fun dissecting plants and naming the different parts of the flowers. We have also looked at Bronze Age settlements and how people lived in those times. In French we are now talking about the seasons and what happens in them.
