### What have Nursery been learning about this week?

In Nursery we have finished our topic Once Upon a Time by learning the story of The Three Billy Goats Gruff. The children have enjoyed retelling the story and creating their own collage of the setting. In group time we have been making our own story maps and practising retelling the story by heart. The children have also enjoyed practising their scissor skills to cut and make masks of the characters. In maths we have been thinking about things that are big and things that are small. We went on a shape walk around the school to see what we could find, the children were very excited to find lots of different examples of big and small things.

#### What have Year 1 been learning about this week?

In Year 1 this week we have finished off our half term with a visit to the school library. The children enjoyed some reading for pleasure as well as a group story time. As well as this, we have been writing our own version of 'Fairy Tale Villains' in English. This is a non-chronological report, in which we wrote about our own evil characters this week. This included – a wicked witch, a troll, the evil stepmother and Captain Hook.

In Maths we have been using our knowledge of addition and subtraction to work out missing number problems. The children showed great understanding of how to use a number line and which way they would need to jump in order to find out what number is going to fit the gap.

#### What have Year 3 been learning about this week?

Over the past week year 3 have had a lots of fun with their learning! In writing, the children have been innovating non-chronological reports, we have written about all sorts of mythical creatures. In science we have continued our investigation into plants and have become keen botanists. Using celery and food colouring to experiment with, we have discovered that stems need warmth for water to travel through them. In art, we took our weaving knowledge outside and created some beautiful fence installations on the football court. The children's teamwork, motivation and patience were really impressive, the children should be very proud of themselves! Well done Year 3!






#### What have year 5 been learning about this week?

This half term, Year 5 have been working extremely hard in all lessons. One piece of work that we are particularly proud of is our sculptures in Art. We have been studying the work of Antoni Gaudi and have been creating our own clay chimneys. We learnt a range of techniques to do this including: making a clay slip and carving. Once we had made the sculptures, we had to let them dry so we could paint them. We deliberately chose vibrant, block colours when painting as we found these mimicked the style of Antoni Gaudi most closely. We think our sculptures look brilliant. Have a look!
