

What Have Reception Been Learning About This Week?

Continuing our topic of 'Around the World and off we go!' we have been looking at the countries Ghana, Nigeria and Poland. We have found out that each country has its own flag, money, food and animals that it is famous for. We have enjoyed writing about and drawing African animals, thinking about the shapes we can see. In maths we have been practising addition and subtraction, choosing whatever we need to help us.



What Have Year 2 Been Learning About This Week?

We are all incredibly proud of the Year 2s for getting through a very challenging week. The year 2s have put in a lot of dedication, hard-work and resilience this week in getting through all of their SATs. They've proven to us what they are capable of and we look forward to the half-term break for a well-deserved rest! Now that SATs are all done - we look forward to our school trip coming up in June. Be on the lookout for a letter that will be sent out shortly. We will be going to Beale Park on Friday 16th June 2023 and know that the children will absolutely love it and all the fun things the park has to offer. Well done Year 2s for getting through a tough week – you should all be so proud of yourselves!

What Have Year 4 Been Learning About This Week?

It has been an action-packed week in Year 4 as we head towards the end of Summer 1! In our reading lessons, the children have been enjoying reading *Charlotte's Web*. Our VIPER skill of the week has been *predict* and we have been very impressed to hear what the children think will happen next throughout different parts of the story. In English, we have been continuing our Myth unit with our model text *How Night Came.* The children have been applying their skills, knowledge and understanding of using inverted commas to punctuate speech. To help us generate ideas for this lesson, the children pretended to be different characters in the story and acted our different parts. They wowed us with their drama skills and creativity!

In maths, the children have been learning all about time. We used practical resources to aid our understanding and the children had fun showing the time in different ways (analogue, digital,12-hour, 24 hour). Thursday was a particularly busy day as the children had their swimming lesson in the morning and

then a STEM session in the afternoon where they made rockets! The children will be having these sessions for the next 6 weeks, provided by STEMazing thank you to Mrs Collins for organising these as DT lead \bigcirc .

What Have Year 6 Been Learning About This Week?

This week, year 6 have begun their topic on climate change, researching fossils fuels and their impact on our Earth. They impressed the entire year 6 team by collaborating in groups to create informative posters, teaching important details about each fossil fuel. The care and attention to detail on every piece of work was amazing to see!



We also announced to the children the details of our end of year production – Matilda the musical! We will begin auditions next week for each role, so will be sending home lyrics to the audition song 'When I grow up'. This will be a great showcase of all the students and their skills – we have some fantastic budding young performers who can't wait to begin!

Finally, a small reminder to keep an eye on emails for some of the amazing things organised for the end of this year.
