What have Reception been learning about this week?

This week in Reception we have started our new topic of 'Growing and Changing'. We have changed our role play areas into Garden Centres and have enjoyed talking to customers on the telephone and also 'planting' seeds ready to grow into new plants. We have listened to lots of different versions of 'Jack and the Beanstalk' and have talked about how they are similar and different. We have also been making our own story maps so that we can retell the story to our friends. In maths we have been exploring different ways to represent 9 and 10 and showing this on ten frames.





What have Year 2 been learning about this week?


This week in Year 2 we've been having lots of fun measuring in centimetres and metres. We've learnt how to accurately measure different objects using our rulers and have especially enjoyed using the metre sticks to measure height and length too! Our unit topic for Science this term is plants and we can't wait to see the results of an experiment that will help us determine what plants need to grow and stay healthy. In History, we are learning all about the history of toys and focussing Barbie – we will be exploring how Barbie has changed over the years to become more inclusive in celebrating difference. We look forward to the upcoming weeks of school and will continue to do our best and work hard!

What have Year 4 been learning about this week?

The children of Year 4 have impressed us this week with their focus and developing independence in lessons. In our reading sessions, we are using the Viper Skill of inference to explore the impression that the different characters of Matilda give us. We all agreed that Miss Honey gives us a more positive impression than Miss Trunchbull! In Maths, we have started our new unit- fractions! We have been exploring wholes and have also been counting beyond the whole. In History, we started to learn all about the Anglo Saxons! We were surprised to learn that the "Scots" were originally from Ireland.

What have year 6 been learning about this week?

Year 6 have returned after half term with many children having completed some impressive independent revision at home. There has been a buzz about our new History topic as the classrooms and corridor have been decorated with historical replica artefacts and an enquiry station erected in the working space outside of class. Children have produced some beautifully illustrated timelines of the key events from World War II and have enjoyed discussing these in lesson times. For part of their homework over the coming weeks, we would like for children to create a project (presented how they wish) to answer the following question: How did WWII affect Reading?


