





## Writing Lesson

Today you will practise using and identifying action words. A verb is a word used to describe an action, state or occurrence. Verbs can be used to describe an action (doing something). For example, the word 'jumping' in this sentence expresses an action: the rabbit was jumping in the field.

Verbs can also be used to describe a state of being (feeling something). For example, the word 'likes' here: The monster likes roller coasters. Or a verb can be used to describe an occurrence (something happening). For example, the word 'became' in this sentence: The caterpillar became a butterfly.

See if you can write an alphabet of action words. Create a list of all the letters of the alphabet and next to each letter, write one action word that begins with that letter.

- D- Dance


