<u>Maths</u> We are learning about reflection, rotation and translation and also about angles with shapes and on straight lines. The year 6 will have a weekly session focusing on arithmetic skills.

We will also be looking at perimeter, area and volume of shapes we will find the area of rectangles, triangles, parallelograms and compound shapes

In <u>English</u> we will be continuing reading Boy 87 by Ele Fountain. We will use our grammar skills to write a biography about the main character

Continuing our work on 'The Princess Blankets' – Carol Ann Duffy's modern fairytale - we will be writing our own modern fairytale.

We have all made great efforts with our reading and read our book daily in school, children should **aim to read this every evening**. Children have comprehension quizzes when they have completed a book to help develop their comprehension skills.

Children also have a regular whole class comprehension lesson focusing on key skills from a range of texts including poetry, play scripts, fiction and non-fiction texts.

PE_every MONDAY (Rounders) and

WEDNESDAY(Cricket). Children need to have a full PE kit in school. This term children will play rounders and cricket. We will also be doing some outdoor running on the school track.

Children can bring a waterproof jacket/mac/top if they like for PE days as we will be out whatever the weather!

We will be considering the question: What do religions say to us when life gets tough?

Music

This term we will focus on music and movement, listening to broad range of music from Greek classics to modern rock.

Computing

We will continue using Power point to replicate how websites are made, creating our own links within an imaginary website.

This half term we have a **Geography** focus. We will look at mountains, where they are located, how they are formed and compare the Himalaya to the Cambrian mountains in Wales.





<u>DT</u> We will be creating our own soft toy, making a mascot that is our own personal cheerleader. We will use recycled fabric such as old t shirts and offcuts of material

In <u>PHSCE</u> we will learn about borrowing and earning money. We will continue with our weekly discussions on current affairs with Picture News.

Science

We will be learning about the circulatory system and how it transports water and nutrients around the body.



Homework

Maths homework is sent out every Tuesday evening and must be returned to school the following Monday. Times Tables test each Monday – keep encouraging your child to practise and use TT Rockstars. They each have their own login.

English homework is sent out on a Thursday to be returned the following Wednesday. Y6 will also have additional SPaG homework in preparation for SATS.
