HOW DO WE SUPPORT PARENT CARERS?

NELPCF have some exciting groups and sessions that we want to share with you:







<u>NELPCF_Tranquil</u> <u>Thursdays</u>

These sessions are open to all parent carers or grandparents of children and young people aged 0-25 who have, or may have, **SEND**. These wellbeing sessions are a much needed boost for many parent carers: you can't pour from an empty cup. Tranquil Thursday sessions take place every Thursday, during term time only, from 12pm-2pm. The next session is: Thursday 6th November at 12-2pm.

NELPCF Walking Group

This group is open to all parent carers or grandparents of children and young people aged 0-25 who have, or may have, **SEND**. We welcome you to come and join us for a light walk and a chat with people who understand. Connect with parent carers whilst connecting with nature. Due to the colder weather, these groups may be less frequent. Please keep an eye on our Facebook page for details of the next **Walking Group**.

NELPCF Paperwork Support Cafe

These sessions are for parent carers to attend to complete paperwork, such as input for Educational Health and Care Plans (EHCPs), Disability Living Allowance (**DLA**), Personal Independence Payment (PIP) or Neurodevelopmental referrals. We are unable to complete or advise on answers but we can explain the questions. We will signpost you to other services if more support is needed. The next Paperwork Support Cafe is on Friday 21st November at 9.30am-12pm.

NELPCF PROJECT SPOTLIGHT

Each term we will be shining a spotlight onto a project that our **NELPCF** team are involved in. This term, we want to tell you all about the **Delivering Better Value in SEND** project.

DELIVERING BETTER VALUE IN SEND

DBV stands for Delivering Better Value in SEND. NELPCF have been involved in the DBV project since it officially began in September 2023. The national project consists of 55 areas, including North East Lincolnshire, who received a one-off grant from the Department for Education (DfE), with the focus of listening to families of children and young people with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities, in order to make improvements to what was available for SEND in our area. The focus was to enhance inclusion and belonging for children and young people with SEND in mainstream settings.

81 parent carers responded to the **DBV** survey, which was released in November 2022. This, along with hearing from all schools in the area, gained a better understanding into the needs arising for **SEND** within schools in North East Lincolnshire. The focus was to then work with schools and SENCos (Special Educational Needs Coordinators) to develop and strengthen their **SEND** knowledge and practice, in order to better support children with **SEND**.

What was the impact from **DBV**?

- All settings in North East Lincolnshire received some form of support from the DBV project.
- Training consisted of: understanding around additional needs; potty training; school readiness skills; Making Sense of Autism training; 200 staff were trained in Intensive Interaction to support children's communication and interaction.
- From the project, an Outreach service was created, to support children in Reception and Year 1 who are suspected to be neurodivergent. The Outreach service has now been running for 2 years and recently a further 3 year contract has been secured.
- All settings were provided with a WELLCOMM screening toolkit which recognises speech
 and language needs. Because of this, Speech and Language needs have been supported
 and there has also been an improvement in Speech and Language waiting times.
- There has been a reduction in permanent exclusions in the ten schools that received tailored training on behaviour culture.

What's next for **DBV**?

As funding for the **DBV** ended in July, the Local Authority are currently looking at ways of how the project can be sustained.

Hi Nic! Can you tell us about yourself?

Hello! I'm **Nic**. I'm 39 years old and I'm married. I'm a very proud Mum to 5 beautiful children and I very much consider ourselves to be a neurodivergent family. Four of my children are either diagnosed or awaiting assessments and our household consists of autism, dyspraxia, ADHD and OCD, to name a few. I'm also currently in the process of an autism assessment for myself.



What's your role in NELPCF?

I'm part of the Management Committee. It's also part of my role to create this newsletter every half term (so it feels very strange interviewing myself!)

When and why did you join NELPCF?

I joined **PCF** in April 2023. At the time I was involved with the Autism In Schools project, and was finishing an EarlyBird course, as a parent carer. I originally joined **NELPCF** to learn more about **SEND** for our area so that I could support my children to the best of my ability. This soon grew to a passion and determination to improve **SEND** provision so that other families didn't experience the unnecessary hurdles that comes with being a **SEND** family. I want to make a difference and to create real change.

What are your passionate interests?

My passionate interest is autism: I feel that I live and breathe autism and I love to talk about! I am also qualified to deliver the EarlyBird course, by the National Autistic Society, and I am the first parent carer in the country to do so. I love 80's music and Erasure is my absolute favourite band in the whole world. I also enjoy writing and I have an English degree.

What's a fun fact about yourself?

When I was younger I used to love spinning until one day I span so fast that I fell over and cut the top of my ear off; I haven't done any spinning since then! I also have a fear of coleslaw!

What would you like to see for the future of SEND provision in NE Lincs?

I would love for future **SEND** provision in North East Lincolnshire to consist of the following: A clear pathway of support for children under the age of 5, from the earliest moments when parent carers may notice a difference in their child; More understanding for neurodivergent children/young people who mask at school; There is so much more research now on how neurodivergence may present in females and I would love for this to be talked about more.
