

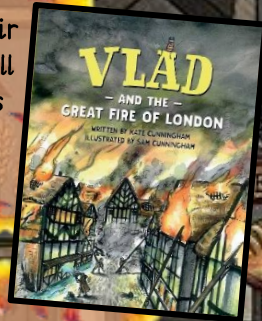


SNAP, CRACKLE AND POP!

KS1 SPRING TERM 2023-2024

English

In English, we will be reading a range of different texts to enrich our learning about The Great Fire of London. We will produce different types of texts including a recount, story and a letter. The children in year 1 will continue with monster phonics, and the children in year 2 will begin to develop their comprehension and grammar skills. They will learn about different word classes such as verbs, nouns and adjectives.



Important Information

P.E will be on a Tuesday and Wednesday.

Reading books and records will be collected in on a Thursday.

Mathematics

Y1: In maths, we will be learning all about the place value of numbers to 50, and how to add and subtract numbers within 20. Later will move onto measurement, where we will learn how to measure length and height in centimetres. We will also learn about mass and volume.

Y2: We will learn all about money including how to find change and calculate using money. We will also learn how to multiply and divide, focusing on our 2, 5 and 10 times tables. Later, we will learn about measuring length and height in metres/centimetres and measuring mass and capacity in grams/kilograms and millilitres/litres.

Physical Education (P.E)

In spring 1 our topics will be gymnastics and dance. In spring 2 we will move onto games involving ball skills.

Computing

We will use online drawing software to design and label our own rockets. We will also learn about the parts of a computer, including the keyboard, mouse and screen.

Jigsaw/PHSCE

Our first topic in Jigsaw is dreams and goals. We will discuss our achievements and identify what we would like to achieve in the future. Our second topic is healthy me, where we will learn about what we need to do to live healthy, happy lives.

Geography

We will learn all about the seven continents of the world, and will locate these on a map. We will explore the different animals that live on these continents and will learn all about their habitats.

Science

In Science we will learn about a variety of everyday materials including wood, metal, plastic, glass, brick, rock, paper and cardboard, and will identify their suitability for particular uses. We will identify which material will be best to make a firefighter's hose. We will also find out how materials can be changed by squashing, bending, twisting and stretching.



History

In History this term, we will be learning all about The Great Fire of London. We will be comparing 17th century London with modern day using both primary and secondary sources. Also, we will be recalling and sequencing the main events of The Great Fire of London on a timeline. We will look at how London was destroyed by the fire and how it has been rebuilt since!

Art

We will look at famous fire artwork created by a range of artists including Jan Griffier, Granger and Jackson Pollock. We will use this art to inspire our own Great Fire of London artwork. We will use pencils to create different tonal values, and use cross hatching to add pattern and dimension to our art.
