Visual/tactile/proprioception: explore box/bag with tinsel, wrapped box, and star decorations.

Visual/proprioception: press switch to control fan. Blow white sheet/muslin in front.

away on the sparkling sea.

Smell/taste: sea salt crystals.

Look at the dolphins,

Visual: Dolphin puppet (hand or stick) moving to encourage visual tracking.

dipping and diving and beaming their big happy grins.

Vestibular: move up and down like dolphins diving through the waves.

Call to the mermaid,

Tactile: sequin cushion.

combing her hair and singing sweet songs to the fish.

Tactile/proprioception: comb own hair with large tooth comb.


We talk to the whale

Auditory: listen to whale song (on a switch).

then slipping and sliding, rise up on its water spout.

Tactile: Spray water spray above learners' heads.

We spy some pirates looking for treasure,




Visual/tactile: real money in a bag.

They climb up the rigging with cutlasses ready.

Vestibular: Mime climbing

Tactile: Feel rope netting (if miming not appropriate)
