CASE STUDY Employer Encounter

'L' goes to Haslingden High School to study Food Technology. Chef Ade visited her Food Preparation & Nutrition lesson at Tor View to talk about and help the students cook Seafood. Students were also able to ask him questions about his work and experiences.



During Enterprise Week students work together to produce a good or a service they can sell at the enterprise fair at the end of the week.

Students can take on specific roles, such as marketing manager, social media curator or finance manager and learn the skills involved with that position.
