

Peter Pan

Wendy, John and Michael Darling lived in a big house in London with their Mum and Dad and their dog, Nana.

Tactile/Visual: Stroke toy dog

One night, Wendy woke up and saw Peter Pan sitting on the floor. He was crying because his shadow wouldn't stick on.

Visual: Make hand shadows on the wall with a torch.

Peter and his fairy Tinkerbell showed them all how to fly then... swoosh! They flew out of the window and all the way to Neverland.

Vestibular: Fly around the room with arms outstretched. OR

Visual: sprinkle fairy dust (edible glitter/coloured sugar) over hands

They flew over an Indian camp and mermaids in the blue lagoon water. Then they landed in the woods and found the Lost Boys' home.

Visual/tactile: touch sequinned material/cushion.

Wendy was a mother to the Lost Boys and read them stories every night. They were happy together.

Visual/Proprioception: Turn pages of a story book.

The pirates were led by Captain Hook. He was scared of a crocodile that went 'tick tock' and wanted to eat him.

Proprioception/tactile: turn key in a wind-up alarm clock

Auditory: listen to sound of clock ticking.

One day, Peter and Wendy saw that the pirates had tied up Tiger Lily, the Indian princess. Peter pretended to be Captain Hook and made the pirates set her free.

Auditory/proprioception: "Set her free!" in pirate's voice on big mack switch.

Captain Hook was furious. He ordered the pirates to catch the children and tie them up on his ship.

Tactile: explore piece of soft rope (e.g. rope curtain tie).

Captain Hook was just about to make the children walk the plank when Peter Pan came to rescue them.

Vestibular: Walk along a wooden plank/line taped on the floor.

AND/OR

Auditory: say "walk the plank" repeatedly (on switch if needed).



Captain Hook jumped up and swung at Peter with his sword. Peter lunged with his sword, and Hook fell into the sea, where the crocodile was waiting for him.

Vestibular: Use cardboard sword to stretch forward OR

Visual/tactile: explore cardboard or plastic sword

Wendy, John and Michael wanted to see their Mum and Dad again. Peter, Tinkerbell and the Lost Boys all flew back to London.

Vestibular: Fly around the room with arms outstretched. OR

Visual: sprinkle fairy dust (edible glitter) over hands

The Lost boys stayed with them but Peter and Tinkerbell went back to Neverland. "Goodbye," said Wendy as they waved them out of sight.

Proprioception: Wave goodbye
