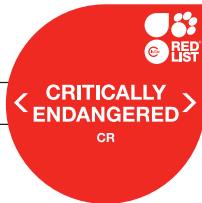

An extremely high risk of becoming Extinct in the Wild

<b>Name</b>	Rufous-fronted Laughingthrush.
<b>Scientific Name</b>	<i>Garrulax rufifrons</i> .
<b>Threats</b> (why they're at risk)	Heavily exploited for the songbird trade. Additional threats include climate change and volcanic activity.
<b>Distribution</b> (where they live)	Western and central Java, Indonesia.
<b>Habitat</b> (what they live in)	Found in mountainous primary forests.
<b>Diet/Feeding strategy</b> (what they eat and how they eat it)	Berries and insects; mostly beetles and caterpillars.
<b>Social behaviour</b> (how they live)	Known to forage in small groups, moving rapidly through the forest. Breed in May/June.
<b>Males and females</b>	No notable difference between males and females.
<b>Lifespan</b> (how long they live for)	Unknown.
<b>Number of young</b> (how many babies)	Two or three individuals.
<b>Interesting fact</b>	They build a solid cup nest in branch forks close to the ground.
