Can you retell the story in your own way?

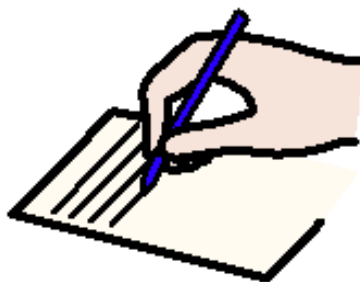
Can you remember who the characters were and what they were like? Describe them in your best words, signs or symbols!
