Science Club News

Mr Burke and Mrs Mableson decided to enter our Science club students in for their Bronze Crest award.

The Crest award is a highly accredited science accolade, which sets out to test a student's ability to plan and carry out an investigation.

The students are investigating the effect of different nutrients on plant growth. For this, they are planting spider plants in conical flasks and will be observing growth over 20 weeks.





Art Competition

This is the fantastic response from three of our students after Bury Police asked schools in the area to design and create a canvas. The canvas had to symbolize the unity between Bury Heritage; Bury Police; The Peel Statue; Bury town centre; schools and communities.

For the last two weeks, students have worked on their canvases every lunchtime, after school and even at weekends. We are so impressed with their commitment, enthusiasm and skill!

Our submissions will now be entered into the main competition, alongside other Bury schools. The winner's canvas will be placed on the wall of the Chief Superintendent's office. The other designs will be featured around the Police station.

Covid Lateral Flow Testing

As you may know, the Government have confirmed that schools will be responsible for testing all students **once** on their return after the Christmas holiday. They have advocated a staggered start in order for schools to manage this safely. We want to reduce any lost time and feel that we can stagger the return within the first few days rather than prolonging the process. With this in mind, the following plan will be in place:

Wednesday 5th January 2022 - Covid training day for staff so no students are in school.

Thursday 6th January 2022 - Years 7 and 11 return to school for their first day of term and they do a lateral flow test at the start of the day in extended tutor time. They will then remain on site unless they test positive.

Friday 7th January 2022 - Years 8, 9, 10 return to school, joining Years 7 and 11, for their first day of term and they do a lateral flow test at the start of the day in extended tutor time. They will then remain on site unless they test positive.

Uniform

I am sorry to have to give the same reminders to all parents yet again. I totally appreciate that the very vast majority of parents are clear about our expectations. Nonetheless, every time we return we have a small minority who return with inappropriate uniform standards. This then causes additional work and unnecessary friction.
